Attendance

Thank you so much to all the parents who are trying so hard to get their children in to school regularly. Attendance continues to be an area we are trying to improve. The target for attendance (set by the government) is 96% and we are currently below this. During the latest week we have data for (week commencing the 16th January, the national rate was 94.9% and at Chulmleigh Primary school it was 90%.

We are also looking at how to improve the children's knowledge (and speed of recall) of the times tables facts. By the end of Year 4, all children should know all of their times-tables up to and including 12 x 12. This is definitely something that parents/grandparents etc can help with.


Staffing

Every Tuesday we now have furry visitors spending the day in Nursery – Guinea Pigs! - and the children get to hold them and stroke them!

Next term our topic will be all about farming, healthy eating and looking for signs of Spring!

Lions

The lovely lions have been very busy preparing for a royal visit this week. A letter appeared in the classroom on Monday explaining that a Lord and Lady were visiting the classroom! The children were very busy making thrones for the visitors, writing questions to ask them during their visit and designing castles to show them. When the royal couple arrived, the children were very proud to show off their writing and model making. They also learnt lots about castles and why people used to live in them.

In Maths the children have been learning about 2D and 3D shapes. The children were set a challenge to make a tall Rapunzel tower using 3D shapes. They looked carefully at each of the shapes and made decisions about which shapes would be good to use at the bottom of the tower.

In Woody Wonders we have been learning about which birds we might spot during wintertime and how we can care for birds during this season. The children made bird feeders using pinecones and spent time watching and recording the birds that they spotted.

We are so proud of the children's reading. They are so enthusiastic and approach each guided reading lesson with such determination. The children especially enjoy reading to their teddies every Friday morning.

Hedgehogs

In year one we are continuing our learning on numbers up to 20. We have been working on adding up by counting on and by using number facts and number bonds to help us. We will soon be starting to look at subtraction.

In English we have started our new book, which follows the lives of seven children around the world, the children have been fascinated by the different ways of life. In our writing we are learning about what verbs and nouns are. We have been using adjectives to describe our nouns to make our writing more interesting. In PE we are continuing to build up our volleyball skills and improving our coordination with catching balls, both with a partner and on our own.

In Science we are learning about how the seasons affect the life around us. We have learnt about changes to trees and animals. In Geography we have looked at cities, London in particular, to see how it is different from where we live. In computing we have been using Purple Mash to write our own stories and to animate them. The children continue to work hard on their reading and are making good progress. Thank you for all your hard work and support at home.

Dragonflies

This week the children have started new topics in Maths and English. In Maths, we have started working on 'Money' - the children have done really well with counting money in pounds and pence and we will carry on with this theme until the end of the half term.

In English, we have started a unit of writing on biographies, which is linked to our history topic of 'Movers and Shakers'. The children have enjoyed finding out about historical figures from different disciplines and we are now looking at Amelia Earhart in English. Next week we will be writing a biography of Julia Donaldson so if you have any of her books at home we would love them to bring them in to share.

We have been finding out about Diwali, the Indian festival of light, in RE. The children have been on a virtual visit to a Hindu temple and read the story of Rama and Sita. The highlight for the children has been making diva pots out of clay and decorating them with paint and glitter. These pots traditionally hold a candle or tea light and line the paths.

In art, the children have been looking at the work of significant still life artists and still life techniques. They have been learning about the use of colour and composition and will be creating their own still life artwork.

We look forward to seeing you at the class assembly on Thursday afternoon.

Barn Owls

Barn Owls have been learning about measuring and we have been using metres, centimetres and millimetres to measure things around the classroom. We have also been changing measurements into different units.

We have been researching fossils which has been fascinating! We are going to use our research to create a double page spread about fossils so this week we have been practising writing in short paragraphs and looking a how to make our information look exciting.

In Art we have also been drawing fossils and looking at how we can improve our artwork.

We were so excited to receive a letter from JK Rowling. We sent her our stories to read and she loved them!



Bumblebees

Bumblebees have been busy writing our very own Paddington stories, working hard to use our SPaG and comedy to make our readers laugh!

We have been enjoying science and exploring matter. Last week we conducted an investigation into fizzy drinks to find out which type of drink had the most carbon dioxide. Turns out it wasn't coke like we predicted, but actually lemonade! We also discovered that American cream soda isn't very nice haha!

Bumblebees have also become experts on the River Taw, knowing where it starts, travels and ends. We're super excited to begin looking at mountains next.

Squirrels

Year 5 have had a very productive week! In Literacy, we have started our new text which is a nonfiction text all about Snakes. We are looking at how the author has used grammatical features such as modal verbs, relative clauses and parenthesis. We are then hoping to write our own version of the text all about farm animals! In Maths, we have been continuing our work on Fractions, looking at how to add and subtract fractions with different denominators using our equivalent fraction knowledge. In PE, we are now applying our volleyball skills in a new context by learning how to play sit-down volleyball!

In Science year 5 have been learning all about the life cycles of mammals. They have used the correct scientific vocabulary to explain the processes and stages involved. In their science books they have demonstrated their learning through producing colourful and informative pages. (See photos).

Art was fun this week as Year 5 were learning to draw humans moving , ensuring that the proportions of the body are accurate. The outcome was some very good drawings. (See photos).

Everyone is excited about our visitor who is coming to school to talk about how they live with being blind and how they care for their guide dog. After some very sensible discussion in PSHE, year 5 are ready to meet them and talk to them next week.


Foxes & Otters

We have now started our new topic 'Maafa'. We have been looking at what Africa is like today and how different it was long ago. We have begun to find out about how the Slave Trade began. This is a very hard- hitting topic, but the children (as always!) are fascinated to learn more and are very inquisitive with their questions. In English we have been studying our new book "Freedom" by Catherine Johnson which is a story based on real life events in the history of slavery.


We have also started our new Science topic: Light. We had great fun experimenting with water and objects to observe how refraction works and have also made periscopes (thank you for the cardboard box donations!).

In Maths, we have just finished our unit on fractions, decimals and percentages and are now moving onto area and perimeter. In their homework, children will begin to get a sheet linking to the work in class as well as a 'mixed questions' sheet to allow them to keep practising the skills and different maths areas we have already covered.


Year 6 are enjoying taking responsibility as the new team captains, School Council, and hall monitors, and getting into the new routine and expectations. Well done, Year 6!


Recycle Charity

Should I keep my child off school?

Yes

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Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like Illness (Including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scables	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics
