Esmee in Year 2 declared, "The swing bars are the BEST!"




Many of our students LOVE football! One of these people is **Frankie in Year 5**, who enthusiastically explained to us, "I love football because I LOVE IT!"


My favourite sport is football! I've been playing football 4-5 years. My biggest achievement is probably when I saved all of the penalties during the last game against

We Care About Animals V



We can leave food out for them and we can make a nest for them or make a little resting place.






Can you think of a time when you have been kind?






