Staff absences

Once again, we have been experiencing a period of increased staff absence at CPS. Covid has struck once more in addition to a round of flu etc. Thankyou all for your patience while we do our best to cover the absences.

There are two more days of strike action planned for this week: Wednesday and Thursday. Chulmleigh Primary school will be open as normal.

Attendance

Thank you so much to all the parents who are trying so hard to get their children in to school regularly. Attendance continues to be an area we are trying to improve. The target for attendance (set by the government) is 96% and we are currently below this. During the latest week we have data for (week commencing the 3rd of March), the national rate was 93.7% and at Chulmleigh Primary school it was 94.4% which is great and an increase on a fortnight ago.

Year 6 pupils are taking 'mock SATs' this week, and next week children from Year 1 to Year 5 will be undertaking end of term assessments in reading, writing and maths. The outcomes of these assessments will be discussed with you at the forthcoming parent's evening meetings. Children are used to taking these assessments each term, and both they and their teachers use the information to identify which areas of learning need re-visiting as we move into the final term of the year.

Due to there being no celebration assembly last week, the team winners weren't reported. The week before last, the Fish were the winners, and last Friday it was the Dogs who were the winning team. As I'm on a course this Friday afternoon, Celebration assembly will be in the morning this week (9.10am).

Cubs & Tigers

The Tigers and Cubs have been really busy learning all about farm life! So far we have had a visit to the Academy farm to see the sheep and chickens with Farmer Mick, we have learnt about sheep and what their young are called, watched short DVD clips on shearing and milking, and hopefully over the next few weeks we will have some small visitors into school in the form of lambs! The children have had great fun making a wonderful Spring wall display which includes woolly sheep and handprint tulips. We have explored the natural environment looking for the first signs of Spring and spotted snowdrops, daffodils and crocuses that have popped up in our plant tubs.

The Nursery children also joined in with the whole school to celebrate World Book Day and some of the children dressed up in some wonderful costumes. All children received a book voucher, too!

Over the next few weeks we will be learning about cows, looking at where milk comes from and tasting different foods that are made from milk.

We will then finish off the term with some exciting Easter activities!



Hedgehogs

In Hedgehogs we continue to practice our phonics and learn new ways of making sounds. Well done for all the reading you are doing at home as this all helps children to consolidate their knowledge and become more fluent readers. In maths we have just started learning about length and height. We have been comparing objects to see which is longer/taller or shorter.

We have continued our learning about London and have learnt some of its history. We learnt how The Great Fire of London started and had great fun making our Great Fire of London pictures. In science we are learning about the temperature at different times of the year. We have set up an experiment to record the temperature at night and during the daytime!

Lions

We had a great time at the farm last week. The children were able to stroke the lambs and visit the chicken coop. The children were able to write about what they saw at the farm and used their craft skills to make animals to put on our farm display.

We have started to think about where our food comes from. We learnt about carrots and watched a video clip to explain how they are planted and harvested. We peeled and chopped some carrots to make a soup. We also planted our own carrot seeds in Woody Wonders this week.

World Book Day was amazing. The children looked fabulous and enjoyed showing their costumes to the rest of the school in a special assembly. They also enjoyed the Bookery who came in to read some stories.





Barn Owls

Barn Owls have been putting in so much effort to improve their handwriting this week. They are all trying to form their letters correctly and think carefully about their presentation – well done Barn Owls! Our class times table for this term is the 6x table – we have been singing songs, making up fortune tellers and practising with our families and our cats!

In Barn Owls we are also looking at volcanoes, locating them on maps and finding out about tectonic plates and how volcanoes are formed. In Art we have been creating prints of Ammonites – we traced an Ammonite then indented the shape in to a polystyrene tile before printing it. We have also made clay representations of an Ammonite.

Dragonflies

World Book Day went well last week and the children enjoyed the author visit and the visit from Crediton Bookery. Thank you for all your support in dressing the children as book characters, they all looked amazing and talked enthusiastically about who they were.

Over the last couple of weeks we have been on a voyage of exploration with Christopher Columbus and the children have been very intrigued by the idea of him discovering the Americas – how could people in the 1490's not know that North and South America were there? And how did they manage without chocolate? In Geography we have been learning about hot and cold countries and how they are zoned across the world.

In Maths we have been looking at delightful division and practising our 5x tables. In the next few days, we'll also be looking at our 2 and 10x tables as part of this maths unit. We are starting to point out that division is the opposite to multiplication and encourage the children to learn the division facts as well as the multiplication facts.

In Science, the children will be learning about living things and their habitats. We are exploring and comparing the differences between things that are living, dead, and things that have never been alive. We are also identifying and describing habitats and identifying plants and other animals.



Squirrels

Year 5 have been working super hard this week! In Maths, we have been finding fractions of different quantities and using fractions as operators. This has been tricky as it involves our times table knowledge as well as our understanding of fractions. In Literacy, we have begun to create our class retelling of Snow White. We have story mapped the key events in the story, written the Evil Queen's autobiography and we are now working towards our extended piece of writing that will retell the story. Mrs Evans can't wait to read them! In the afternoons, we have begun to learn about Spreadsheets in Computing, continued developing our fielding skills in PE and have looked at citrus farming across the world in Geography. A very busy week!

In Science this week Year 5 have been focussing on the parts of a flower and learning all about their roles in pollination. Initially the flowers were studied using a microscope before being dissected and each part being carefully identified. The separate parts were then attached to card and carefully labelled.



Foxes & Otters

The weeks are flying by! As part of our link between English and Topic, Year 6 are writing and designing a tourist leaflet, encouraging visitors to explore a country in Africa. They are using some of their previous geographical learning to make these very appealing and interesting. In topic lessons they have been learning about the Windrush generation – and how nearly half a million families came to Britain from the Caribbean after WW2 with the offer of new jobs and opportunities. Our children have been shocked by some of the experiences of Black people in this topic, and have had some powerful discussions.

The children have been enjoying listening to a range of musical styles on stringed instruments (from classical to rock and all stops in between) and recalling previous science learning as to how the sound is made and travels.

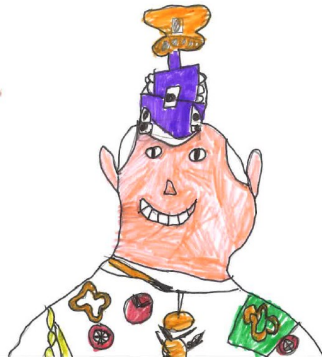

RECIPE of the Month

Tomato and Vegetable Pasta Bake

INGREDIENTS

120g Carrots
90g Red Pepper
60g Courgette
(or any vegetables that you have at home)
6ml Vegetable Rapeseed Oil
3g Garlic Puree
600g Passata
300g Penne Pasta
75g Grated Cheddar

SERVES 4

The dish costs less than £5 to make!

METHOD

1. Dice the courgette and red pepper, grate the carrot and add this to the pan along with the oil and garlic puree. Mix well together and allow to cook on a medium heat for 5-10 mins to soften. Add the passata, mix well. Leave on a low heat for 20 mins to cook (add a little water if the sauce thickens too much).
2. Cook the pasta in a pan of boiling water until just tender but still has a little bite (it will cook further in the bake so you don't want to overcook it in the water).
3. When the pasta has cooked, drain and add it to the sauce; pour into trays and sprinkle over the cheese.
4. Place in the oven on 200°C for about 10 minutes until the cheese is golden and bubbling.

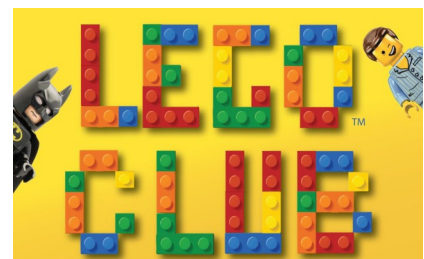

Should I keep my child off school?

Yes

Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

but make sure you let their school or nursery know about...

Hand, foot and mouth	Glandular fever
Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek
