The primary purpose of a <i>cathedral</i> is to be a place of Christian worship</p> <p>Old and New Testament – sections of the Christian bible</p> <p>Holy Spirit Christians believe the Holy Spirit is the part of God who is here on Earth. They sometimes call the Holy Spirit God's 'helper' and it can be symbolised by fire, wind or even a dove.</p> <p>Genesis The Book of Genesis opens the Hebrew Bible with the story of creation. God, a spirit hovering over an empty, watery void, creates the world by speaking into the darkness and calling into being light, sky, land, vegetation, and living creatures over the course of six days.</p> <p>Humanist- Humanistic philosophy and values reflect a belief in human dignity and science — but not religion</p>
