The **climate** in **Egypt** will be different to that of the **UK**.


Who were the Ancient Egyptians and where did they live?

The **Ancient Egyptians** lived about 3000– 5000 years ago.

The River Nile

-The **River Nile** was very important to **Ancient Egypt** as it provided **fertile soil** and water for the **crops**.

-The **Nile** allowed the Egyptians to use **irrigation**. This was a method of **farming** that used **fresh water** to keep the **crops** alive and well fed.

-The **Nile** also provided mud for bricks and pots. Opportunities for fishing and a quick way to travel around the country.

Pyramids and Mummies

Ancient Egyptians believed in many different **gods** who were in charge of different parts of their life.

Mummification was the process of **preserving** a body. **Ancient Egyptians** thought this was very important as it would help them in their journey through **The After-life**.

The bodies of important people such as **Pharaohs** were placed in pyramids which were built as **tombs**. They were surrounded by lots of valuable objects from their lives and **hieroglyphics** were written on the walls.



Tutankhamun and Howard Carter

Tutankhamun is a very famous pharaoh from Ancient Egyptian times.

His **tomb** was found about 3000 years after his death by a **archaeologist** named **Howard Carter**.

Most Ancient Egyptian tombs had been robbed, damaged or destroyed however **Tutankhamun's tomb** was in perfect condition and unopened.

Howard Carter's discovery has helped us to learn lots about the **Ancient Egyptians**.
