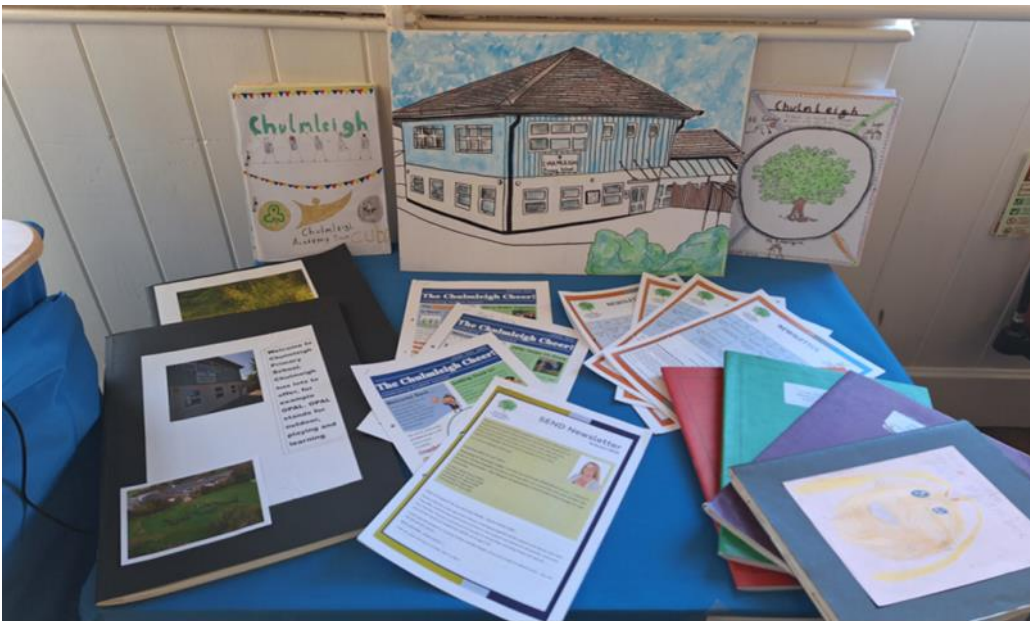

As expected, everyone has settled back to the last half term of the year brilliantly.

### **Chulmleigh Parish Council Meeting:**

Just before half term, I had the pleasure of attending Chulmleigh's Parish Council meeting to represent the school and meet with other organisations in the town. Chulmleigh College were also there. 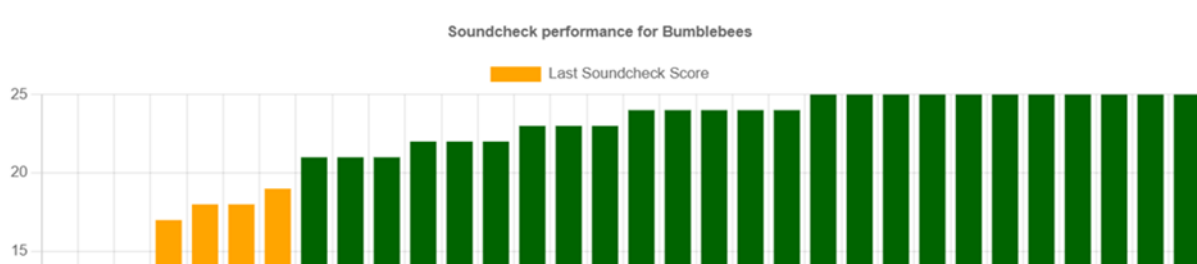
### **Sports Day:**

A huge thank you to everyone who come along to support their child(ren) for our wonderful sports day just before we broke up for half term. It was joyous to see so many of you enjoying a picnic with your children and friends at lunchtime. As ever, the children were amazing and showed true sportsmanship and teamwork in all events when cheering and supporting one another.

Once again, I would like to say a massive thank you to Mrs Welch for all her hard work, energy and organisation in making it such a memorable day. Thank you also to the parents who took the time to pass on their thanks and appreciation of day. Finally, additional thanks and gratitude go to the PTA as ever, for all their hard work during the day which raised an impressive £462.63. This money really will help to enhance every child's education across the school.

## Year 4 Multiplication Table Check

In the next 2 weeks, Year 4 children will be completing an on-screen multiplication check consisting of 25 times table questions. Each child will be able to answer 3 practice questions before taking the actual check. They will then have 6 seconds to answer each question. On average, the check should take no longer than 5 minutes to complete. The purpose of the check is to determine whether they can fluently recall their times tables up to 12, which is essential for future success in mathematics. We know all the children have made some amazing progress in Year 4 already and many have already scored full marks in the practice tests and when completing their Times Tables Rock Star (TTRS) challenges. Below are the results of a recent TTRS challenge. We know Year 4 are going to do well in the next couple of weeks if they carry on with this pleasing progress.

## Safeguarding Updates – Devon’s Mini-police programme

Year 5 are coming to the end of their ‘Mini-police’ sessions soon led by Devon’s community policing teams. Every week, for the past few weeks, Year 5 have been learning about keeping themselves, their family, friends, neighbours and even the whole community safe. The policing team have told us that they have been impressed with how much the children already know about keeping themselves and others safe, and how mature and thoughtful the questions they have generated have been. I know the children have loved these interactive sessions covering a wide range of safety messages. It is good to know that Chulmleigh and surrounding areas are in safe hands with the next generation!

## School Improvement Update – Trialling key stage 1 Phonics screening check materials

Excitingly, we have been selected to trial the phonics screening check materials for key stage 1. The National Foundation for Educational Research (NFER) is conducting this work for the Standards and Testing Agency (STA), which is part of the Department for Education. Each year STA will trial potential future national curriculum tests with a representative sample of children and schools across the country. This trial plays a critical role in developing tests that are valid, fair, accessible and reliable. Our Year 1 pupils will complete the check on a set date during the period 16 to 27 June 2025. They will be selected through a random sample by the STA in advance of the testing.

**This project is confidential so no report of this work will identify any school or pupil that participates. Our children will not** be under any additional stress by helping with this research and trialling. The purpose of these trials is to ‘**test the tests**’ and not the children. We have a NFER test administrator visiting soon who will work with Miss Johnson and the children. They will explain that they are helping with research as are we.

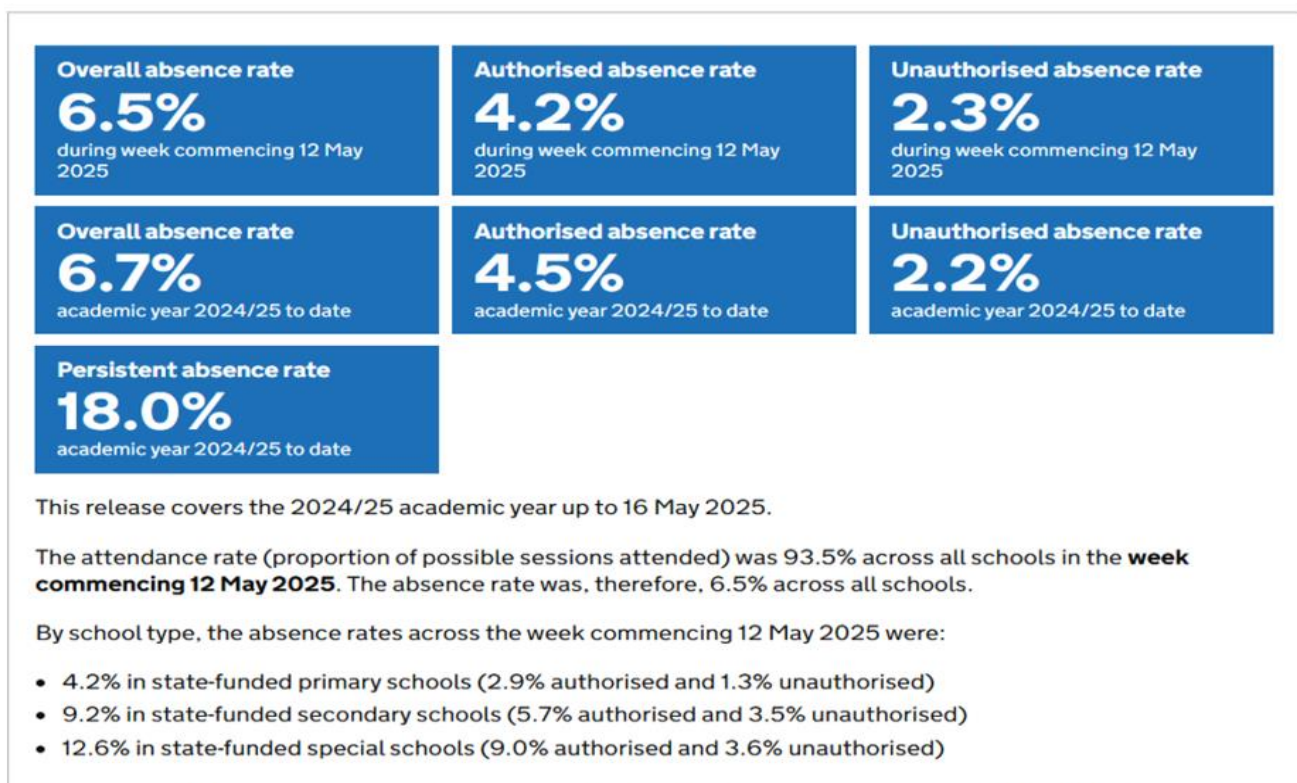
## Uniform:

### Cubs and Tigers

We've had an exciting start to this half term!

The Tigers and Cubs have helped to build a fantastic pirate ship and we've been busy looking for treasure and making treasure maps.

Our topic this half term is 'Under the Sea' and so we have been counting fish, drawing maps and pretending to be pirates.

It's been lots of fun singing pirate songs too!



### Lions

The Lions were amazing during sports day. They were so grown up and listened carefully to all the instructions. They were not fazed at all by the number of people on the field. We loved seeing them race with such confidence, supporting each other and happy to take part. They were a real credit to the school. They have also enjoyed replicating some of the activities in our Early Years playground during outdoor play. The children enjoyed making their own medals and awarding them to each other.

This term our topic is 'on the beach.' We have been discussing all the things we might see at the seaside. The children enjoyed sharing pictures of their visits to the beach over the half-term. They then wrote about these and drew some amazing seaside pictures. The children have also been busy creating their own ice-cream shop, equipped with a vast array of flavours. They made their own price lists with one particular ice-cream costing £100!



## Hedgehogs

We've had a busy start to the final half-term!

In Phonics, we have been doing lots of recap this week in preparation for the Phonics Screening Check. We have been revisiting lots of sounds that we already know, and placing an emphasis on finding these in real, and made-up words. The children have been continuing to read and spell the common exception words.

In English, we have started a new book called "The Whale who ate plastic". The children have been enjoying the story and thinking about the meaning of the story. Over time, the children will be learning some facts about recycling and plastic. They will also be thinking of the impact on sea-life and will create an information page to tell people why they should recycle.

In maths this week, the children have started to learn about 'position and direction'. They have learnt about left and right, and different types of turns, such as quarter and half turns. We've been outside and directed our partners from one place on the field, to another.

Our topic this half-term is 'Local area'. This week, the children have looked at maps. Together, we discussed what a 'birds-eye view' is and thought about what our classroom might look like from this view. The children created their own birds-eye view map of our class, including lots of details about the room.

In science, the children have been re-visiting 'materials'. They thought about a specific material and then what object may be made from this. In the next few weeks, they will be looking at the properties of different materials, thinking about some of the similarities and differences between them.

We have an exciting DT project this half-term! In groups, the children will be creating a car, using an axle and wheels, and lots of recycled materials. They have created team names this week, along with a logo that may be on the side of their car.

We are looking forward to our drumming workshop on Tuesday next week, as well as our class photos on Wednesday! It will be another super busy week in Year 1.

## Dragonflies

We've had another busy couple of weeks in Year 2.

This week, we were lucky to have a visit from 'Peninsular Dental Social Enterprise'. They deliver oral health education sessions to schools and other community organisations. The Open Wide Step Inside Programme involved a 45-minute teaching session which included a 15-minute animated film about Geoffrey the Giant who doesn't like to look after his teeth and has never visited the dentist! With the help of his friends Geoffrey learns some important key oral health messages which are vital to help keep his mouth and teeth healthy. Following the film there was an interactive session, instilling important key messages around oral health.

In maths, we've been learning about fractions. The children have been working hard to understand halves, quarters and thirds. This has involved learning to find fractions of shapes and of amounts. I have been really impressed with how hard the children have worked.

In English, we've been exploring adding suffixes to words. The children have been learning the different rules linked to this and have been encouraged to demonstrate this in their writing.



## Barn Owls

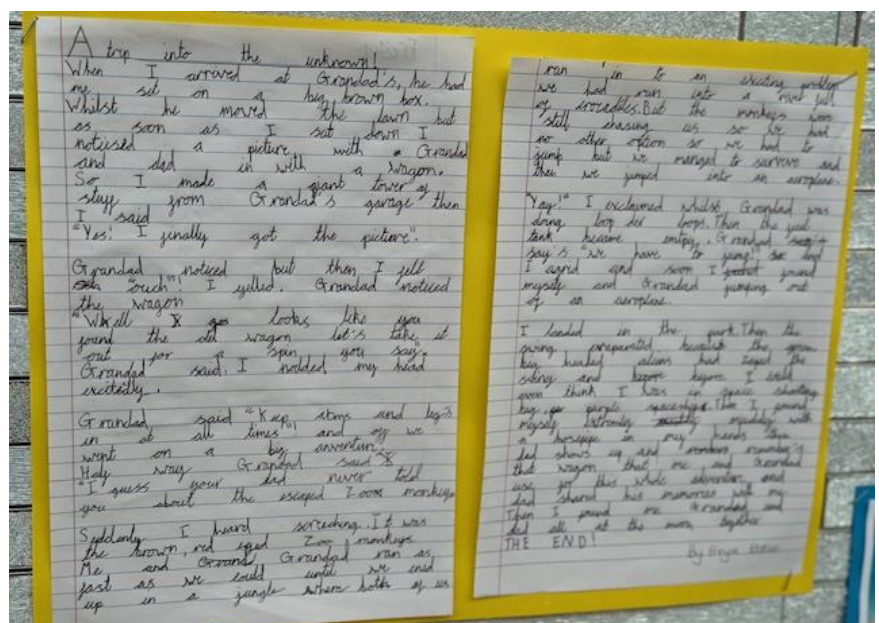
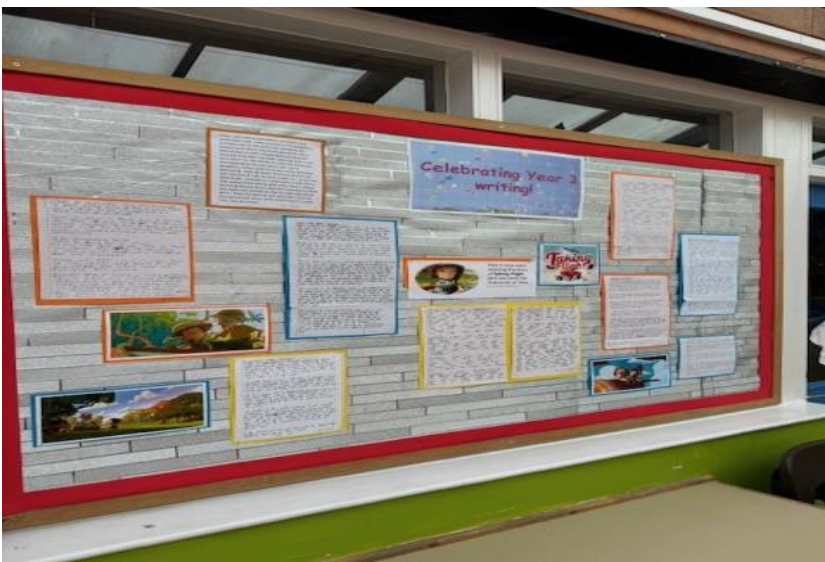
Barn Owls have returned full of energy for the rest of the Summer Term! There are many exciting things planned so it's going to be a busy one!

This week we are finishing off our geography topic about Europe, learning about how and why many people move around and emigrate to different countries. This is not just for visits, but for making a new permanent home in some cases and also how this changes the diversity in all the countries. Next week we are beginning our new history topic on Anglo-Saxons, in preparation for our Living History visit to the Wildwood Trust at Escot on 16<sup>th</sup> June.

In maths we have begun our new arithmetic topic on fractions. It is great that so many of Barn Owls have really been trying hard with their times tables as this is a foundation Year skill for understanding fractions. Thank you for supporting them.

In English we are introducing a weekly visit on Tuesdays to the College library in order to help the children broaden their reading choices, authors and styles. It is very important that the books are looked after and returned – otherwise this will incur fines. I have a box in the classroom for the children to place their finished book after they have read and quizzed it, so it doesn't get lost before the next visit. This is important preparation for their independence in reading in Year 4. Thank you for your support with this.

As I said on Class dojo last term, the children have completed their story-writing (see the photos attached of some of their work now on display). I am so proud of all of their writing achievements!



## Bumblebees

Bumblebees have had a great start to this half term! They have shown great determination and resilience with the Times Tables Check and we are really proud of them all. The progress they have made with learning their times tables this year is an absolute credit to them. Everyone has made great progress and on the website we use in class, we have a good three quarters of the class scoring twenty, or higher, out of twenty-five! 😊

We are continuing our learning about Ancient Egypt this week and have been mummifying tomatoes! Next week we will start our new topic. Science is very interesting this half term, as we are looking at habitats from an environmental point of view. The children have completed fantastic pieces of work on deforestation and the destruction of habitats. Our English continues to be great fun, as we conclude our work on Paddington and the children are excited to be writing their own stories this week! In French we are learning the names of animals and in RE we are learning about different religious festivals!



## Squirrels

Our highlight for the last week of term was definitely Sports Day. The children took part with a great deal of enthusiasm and it was lovely to see so many of them having a go regardless of whether they were going to win. It was also really lovely to see how supportive they were of each other as well. It was a lovely day and they should feel very proud.

In our other learning, we have just finished a unit on shape. In particular, we have been classifying, measuring and calculating angles. Learning to use the protractor has needed a bit of practice but they have made great progress. We are now starting a unit on co-ordinates so if you are out anywhere with a map, please encourage the children to have a good look at the co-ordinates. In English, we finished our amazing writing about Chulmleigh which is in large books that are going to be displayed in the entrance to school so please do take a look. We have started learning all about Cracking Contraptions! We will be inventing our own Cracking Contraption and writing about it. We still have a few lessons on our science unit about puberty to finish. We have really enjoyed our mini-police unit and are now waiting to complete the final lesson with the speed gun – watch out!



## Otters and Foxes

Everyone now has their part for the end of year production and the response to our play 'Oliver with a Twist' has been incredible and the children seem really excited about it. We have been so impressed with how they have already begun learning the words to the songs and how so many of them have learnt their lines over the half term. Please can you support your children to be confident at saying their lines off by heart.

We have begun practising in Heywood Hall and slowly it is all going to start coming together in the coming weeks and we cannot wait to show you.

## GOVERNANCE

### **Primary Performance Board – Parent Member**

The Primary Performance Board meets regularly to fulfil their delegated responsibilities as set out in the Trust Board Scheme of Delegation. The Performance Board incorporates a parent from Chulmleigh Primary school, as well as directors and senior staff.

The Primary Performance Board has a key strategic function in supporting the school, sometimes challenging the school, and influencing and shaping decisions that affect the school. Key responsibilities can be seen on the school website under the “For Parents” tab, then selecting “Primary Performance Board”.

Parent members of the Performance Board are representative of parents, and their duty is to act in the best interests of the children in the school, conveying appropriate messages or opinions expressed to them by other parents, without acting as advocates for a particular parent or group.

Parent members attend performance board meetings, read papers, prepare questions, and get to know the school, by arranging occasional visits during school hours.

The parent member for Chulmleigh Primary is Hannah Doornbos.

The Primary Performance Board meets four times a year, and reminders and updates regarding the meetings will be placed in future newsletters.
