Over the last couple of weeks, all children across the school completed assessments in reading, grammar, punctuation and spelling as well as in maths. Teaching staff have marked and analysed the children's scores and have adapted their plans and teaching accordingly to ensure their teaching is covering any gaps in knowledge or understanding from the assessment tests. Year 6 pupils completed their practise SATs and we have seen some great progress from all children which is fantastic – keep working hard Year 6!

## Dragonflies

What a busy first term it has been! We are incredibly proud of how hard the children have worked over the past few months. A huge highlight of this half term was our wonderful KS1 Christmas performance. We are so proud of all of the children. We have completed all of our Autumn term assessments. The children have made progress in all areas of their learning, and we will continue to build on this progress in the new year.

In the Spring term, our geography topic is called 'Weather Experts'. In this the children will learn that different countries around the world have different climates, they will learn where the equator is located and that countries closer to the equator have hotter climates, they will learn how weather is measured and recorded, all about the different weather symbols and weather dangers.

In science, we will be looking at habitats around the world. The children will identify that most living things live in habitats to which they are suited and describe how different habitats provide for the basic needs of different kinds of animals and plants, and how they depend on each other.

They have also completed their amazing dance to Dominic the Christmas Donkey.

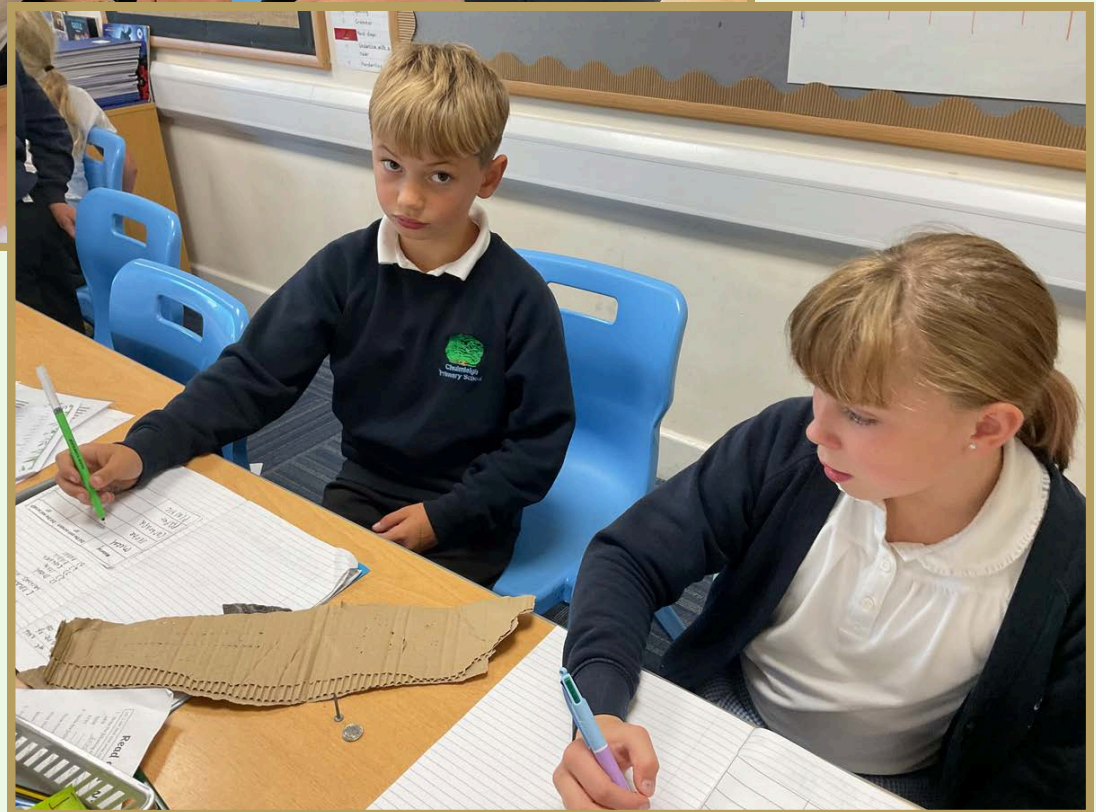
As well as this, we have investigated corrosion in science and thought about burning as an irreversible change.

### December's Musician of the Month










**About:** Astor Piazzolla was an Argentine tango composer, bandoneon player, and arranger. His works revolutionized the traditional tango into a new style termed 'nuevo tango', incorporating elements from jazz and classical music. A virtuoso bandoneonist, he regularly performed his own compositions with a variety of ensembles. In 1992, American music critic Stephen Holden described Piazzolla as "the world's foremost composer of Tango music".

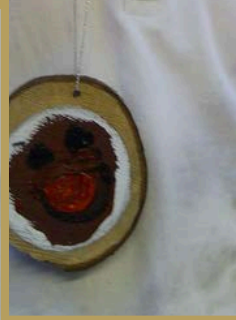

# Admissions Information

## Admissions policy for 2027-28: Annual Consultation

Along with all other schools and academies in Devon, we are consulting on an admission policy for 2027-28. The Local Authority is also consulting on its arrangements – the admissions schemes through which you can apply. You are invited to look at the proposal new policies which are based on policies for this year and next year and to have your say on them.
