## Dear Parents and Carers

Welcome back! The children have settled back brilliantly again after the half term.

We have also had some exciting events happening across the school already since we have been back.

Highlights have included a whole school assembly from the fire service, an interfaith assembly on Buddhism for KS 2, Nursery and Reception completing a local walk, Years 3 and 4 girls having a football training session with Chulmleigh Youth Football Club, Years 1, 2 and 3 visiting the children's book show at the Northcott theatre and the whole school participating a Diwali dance workshop from the West End in schools company. Our wonderful PTA kindly funded half of this workshop which the children tell me was great fun and enjoyable.

On Sunday, Mrs DeFuyck and I were joined by Scarlett and Rueben from our school council to represent the school at the Remembrance service by the War Memorial in town.

Both represented the whole school amazingly and were so mature when laying the wreath and taking part in the thought provoking service. A huge thank you to them both and their families for joining in this important ceremony.



As part of the Remembrance service, Reverend Christine spoke about the result of war leading to suffering in so many ways including homelessness, hunger, loss of livelihoods and security which encapsulates our values which I spoke about in our Armistice assembly with the children.

As well as observing the 2 minute silence as a mark of respect, I explained the impact the first and second World Wars had on Chulmleigh and the surrounding villages including Chawleigh, Lapford and East Worlington in our Trust schools. The children were also quite shocked to hear how many lives were lost in each local community and the impact that was felt in many families even to this day.

Lest we forget.



Last week, we were visited by one of Devon's Senior Safeguarding Practitioners as we chose to have an external audit of our thorough and robust safeguarding procedures. As part of our visit, she checked records and logs on attendance, safeguarding incidents, minutes of meetings the safeguarding team have attended and our interview and induction processes. She also spoke to many children and staff and observed part of OPAL playtime during her morning. Her final feedback included how knowledgeable our children were on being safe, how knowledgeable the staff were on knowing how to keep all children safe and how happy, content and kind our children were. This feedback was lovely to hear and she was keen to share this with the children which she did before she left. She even told people how great our school was on a training session the next day that was attended by other professionals including Trust staff which was pleasing to have reported back to us.

This week, the children have also been thinking about the importance of celebrating differences and calling out behaviour that is unacceptable as part of Anti-bullying week. Ms Keen (as PSHE Lead) reminded the children of these important messages during her whole class assembly on Anti-bullying.

Just before half term, the PTA held their AGM. During the meeting, the previous year's accounts, fundraising events and successes were shared by the Chair and Treasurer.

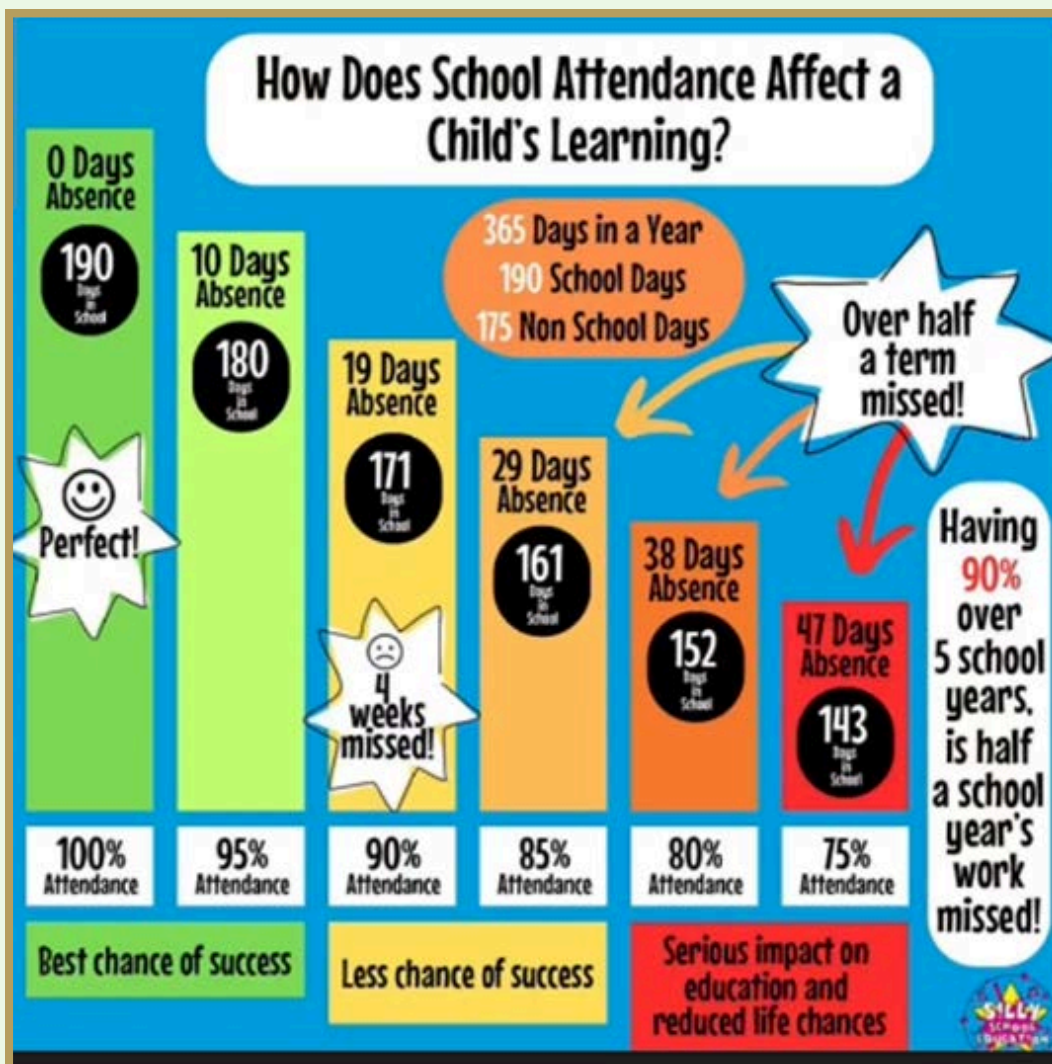
This year's priorities and events were also discussed. I would just to thank all PTA volunteers again for all their hard work in raising vital funds which benefit EVERY child in school.

Finally, as you are aware, our Trust has an unwavering commitment to improve attendance and punctuality at school as we know what a difference it makes to the children's attainment and progress.

The poster below highlights how missing just 19 school days in a year equates to 4 weeks missed of school. Shockingly, if a child misses just 10% of their school year, every year for 5 years, then this is equal to missing half a year's schooling in those 5 years!

This obviously has a massive impact on the child's attendance and the progress they can make.

## Cubs and Tigers

We have been so busy in Nursery!

We have been creating messy firework pictures outside and had a lot of fun flicking paint!

We had a science experiment and made a rainbow on a plate using skittle sweets, it was fun to watch the colours slowly spread and mix.

We made some beautiful poppies for remembrance day and we were lucky enough to have Nikki bring in her clarinet and play for us. She played the Last Post which was beautiful and Let it go from Frozen! Some of the children dressed up as Elsa and danced while she played. It's been a lot of fun!



## Reception

During this half-term, the children will learn about different celebrations, including Bonfire Night, Diwali and Christmas. During the lead up to Christmas, our learning will look at the traditions of Christmas and the Christmas nativity. It's such an exciting time of the year!

Last week the children learnt about Diwali. We used chalk and coloured rice to make our own rangoli patterns. This linked nicely with our work on shape. In maths the children learnt about the properties of triangles and circles, sorting these shapes and describing them; I know it is a triangle because....

We also continued our work on healthy eating. We decided to make some pumpkin soup! The children loved scooping out the pumpkin. They all tried the soup and some even said they thought it was delicious!



## Hedgehogs

It has been another busy start in Year 1!

In Phonics, we have learnt the 6 split-vowel digraphs, along with reading and writing words with these new sounds in. The children love learning the new 'yellow' sounds!

In English, we have been learning and writing about Bonfire night. We have watched a video about why we celebrate this night, and then shared our own experiences of going to these events. We have been writing simple sentences, using adjectives and also using 'and' in a sentence.

In maths, we have carried on with addition. We have been writing lots of number sentences and using pictures to help us do this. We have also been looking closely at number problems this week, which can be very tricky!

In Topic, we have started learning about the Great Fire of London. The children are really enjoying this topic.

Our topic for Science this half-term is all about our senses. The children will have lots of experiences of using their senses over the next few weeks.

We have also been designing our Christmas tree decoration, and will practise some sewing techniques in the upcoming weeks which is super exciting!

We had a lovely trip to Northcott theatre, where the children enjoyed watching lots of different Science experiments. They sat beautifully and did an amazing job and representing the school. The children also did a fantastic job in their Diwali Dance workshop on Wednesday, and managed to tell a story through mime. They did a great job at remembering all of the moves!



## Dragonflies

Year 2 have had a busy and exciting start to the new term! Last week the children enjoyed a visit from the Fire Service, who taught them all about fire safety in the home. Everyone listened carefully and asked brilliant questions. This week we have also enjoyed a Diwali dance workshop. The children loved learning new dance moves and finding out about the 'festival of lights'!

In English, the children have been using their knowledge from history lessons to write about the Gunpowder Plot. The children worked hard to write super sentences about Guy Fawkes and the plot to blow up the Houses of Parliament. Following on from this we will use the knowledge gained about the importance of Remembrance day to produce an information page linked to the different colored poppies and their meanings. This is linked to our History question - how are important events from the past remembered today ?

The children have also begun learning their Christmas songs, and the excitement is already building ! It's been a busy and brilliant start to the new term.

Barn Owls have had a really exciting first few weeks back!

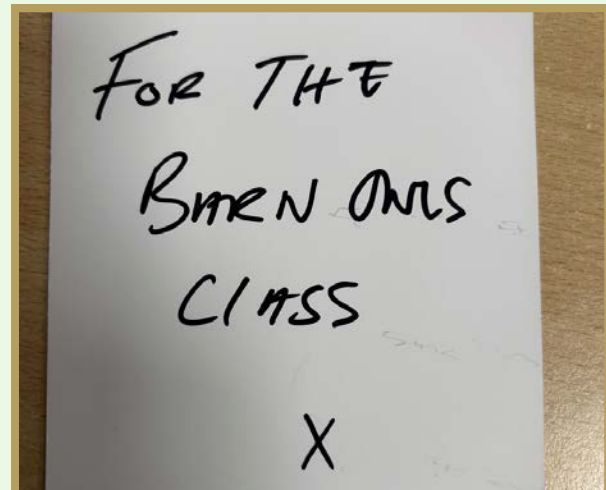
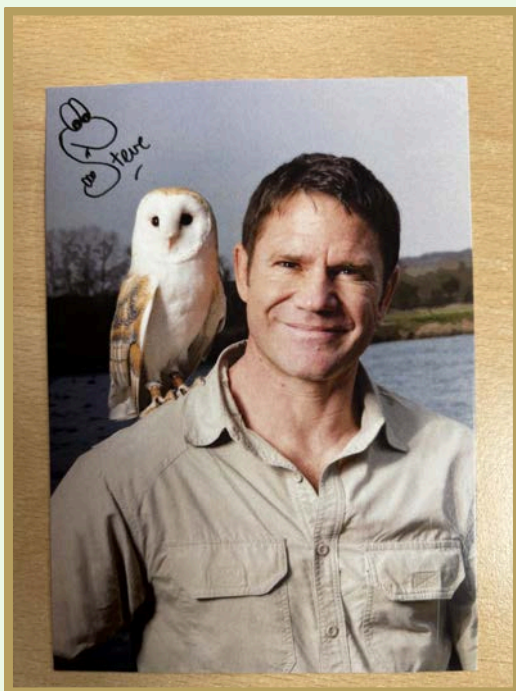
We received an amazing signed picture from Steve Backshall with a Barn Owl sitting on his shoulder as he had seen all of our amazing sedimentary rock information sheets.

















We have been adding and subtracting across 10s and 100s – it has been great to see so much resilience in our class!

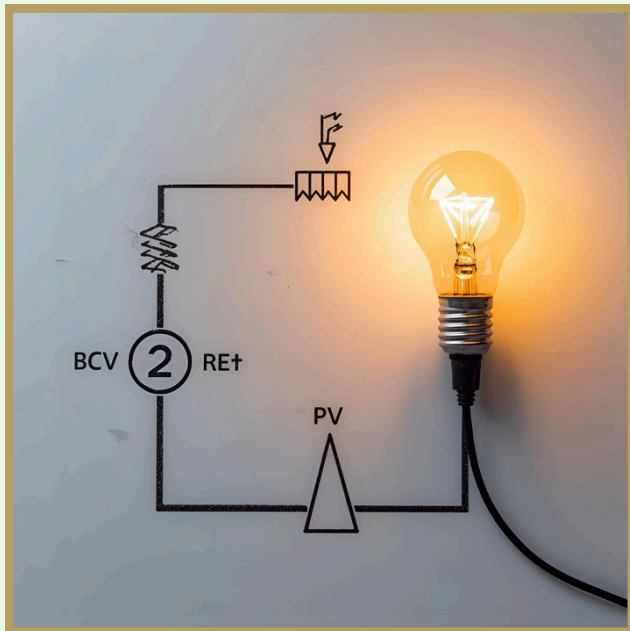
## Bumblebees

## George Frideric Handel

**About:** George Frideric Handel (23 February 1685 – 14 April 1759) was a German-British Baroque composer well known for his operas and concertos. Handel received his training in Halle and worked as a composer in Hamburg and Italy before settling in London in 1712, where he spent the bulk of his career and became a naturalised British subject in 1727. Handel's music forms one of the peaks of the "high baroque" style, bringing Italian opera to its highest development, creating the genres of English oratorio and organ concerto, and introducing a new style into English church music. He is consistently recognized as one of the greatest composers of his age.

We call them the 4Ts. If you or your child are weeing more often, constantly thirsty, more tired than usual, or losing weight for no reason, it could be a symptom of type 1 diabetes. If left undiagnosed, type 1 diabetes can be fatal. If you're experiencing any of the 4Ts, ask your doctor for a test immediately.
