This month, we have been celebrating Black History Month across school. Wow! The Lions have been in Reception for a whole half-term! They are absolutely amazing children and have learnt so much in such a short amount of time.

This week we have been talking about being healthy, both through the food we eat and being active. The children tried eating healthy snacks, including pitta with hummus and fruit kebabs.

We have spent lots of time being active outside using the wheeled vehicles and going on Autumn walks.

Hedgehogs

It has been a lovely first term with Hedgehogs and I can't believe it is half-term already!

This week, we have learnt our last 'red' sound, which was 'ed' for dropped (t) / rained (d). We then recapped all of the sounds we have learnt by playing some fun games of Phonics bingo!

In English, the children wrote their own 'Noises' poem, about sounds they can hear in the classroom. They have all written beautifully, with careful handwriting. We have finished this week by looking at some autumnal photos, and orally rehearsing some simple sentences that we can have a go at writing.

In maths, we have been looking at part-whole models, and using them to help us write addition number sentences. We learnt that there are 4 different number sentences in an addition fact family! At the end of the week, we moved on to thinking about number bonds within 10.

This week in geography, the children were looking at the difference between human, and physical geographical features. They then had to sort some pictures into these 2 groups.

In art, we finished the week by creating our own colour wheel. We started with the primary colours and then filled in the gaps by mixing the correct primary colours together to make secondary colours. Their wheels were painted super neatly, and they tried really hard to keep the paint within the lines.

In PSHE, the children have looked at the different types of crossings and have been discussing lots about road safety. The children then had to order the process of crossing the road safely.

Dragonflies

The children have had a busy few weeks.

In spelling, they have been learning all about homophones and they have worked hard to use the correct words when writing their sentences and in maths we have moved on to addition and subtraction.

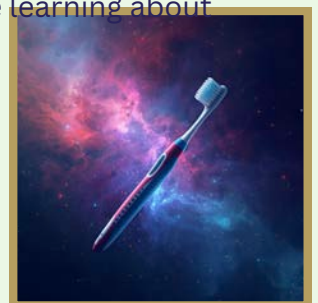
In English we have been looking at the book 'Creature Features'. The children have been looking at the range of adjectives in the text, and we have discussed different sentence types.

Today, we had a visit from Peninsular Dental, they delivered an oral health education session to the class.

The children enjoyed the animated film about Geoffrey the Giant, who doesn't like to look after his teeth and has never visited the dentist! With the help of his friends Geoffrey learns some important key oral health messages which are vital to help keep his mouth and teeth healthy. Following the session, the children were able to answer the range of questions linked to keeping your teeth healthy.

After half term, our topic in History will be 'Beyond Living Memory'. This will include learning about Remembrance Day, The Gunpowder plot and the Wright brothers' first flight.

We hope you have a lovely half-term break.



Barn Owls

Barn Owls have had the most amazing half term!

They have really improved in their learning attitudes and are really trying hard with all of their learning.

Every Barn Owl has created a clay pot, which has involved learning how to use clay techniques like rolling, squashing and blending the clay together. They showed real resilience with this and didn't quit when things didn't quite go as planned!

Barn Owls have been amazing at sending each other kind emails and including attachments.

Bumblebees

Bumblebees have been working hard in maths this half term. We have learnt our 4, 8 and 6 times tables.

This week we had a practical maths lesson practising exchanging, when subtracting two four digit numbers.

The children have all worked really hard on their reading and everyone is making steady progress - well done Year 4!

In science we have been learning about food chains and the importance of keeping them balanced.

In history we have finished off our Vikings topic with some learning about their weapons and their Gods.

We had a fantastic handball tournament with East Worlington and Lapford schools. We were all so proud of their teamwork and skill when playing together.

We have enjoyed drawing in art this half term and learning about Hinduism in RE.



Squirrels

What a fantastic half term Squirrels have had! I hope that they will all have a very well-earned rest. This week, we have completed our draft and final version of our speeches. The children have been working hard to ensure their speeches are really persuasive.

In maths, we are part-way through the multiplication and division unit which includes many new concepts such as cube and prime numbers. We will continue with this after half term.

The children have used their sketching techniques to draw some very impressive pictures of Henry VIII.

In science, we have been filtering, sieving and learning about evaporation. The children completed an experiment to see which was the best technique to separate different mixtures. I have included some photos.

Our PSHE lessons for the last few weeks, have been about peer pressure and making good choices. For our oracy work, we have been working on talking in sentences to each other. We have also been practising listening to what has been said and building on that when we respond.

Otters

What another fab couple of weeks Year 6 have had! They have been learning about Anne Frank and are in the process of writing biographies about her life.

They continue to be enthralled by the World War Two topic and are asking so many questions – it is amazing!!

As part of the topic, they made vegetable turnovers using a rationing recipe and they all turned out brilliantly – some were eaten in class, some were taken home and there was generally positive feedback given when reading their evaluations.

After assessment week, they have been revisiting areas of maths that they need to feel more confident in and have been trying so hard and their maths skills are improving every day.

It has been an amazing first half term with the awesome Otters. They have worked so incredibly hard, and I am proud of them all!

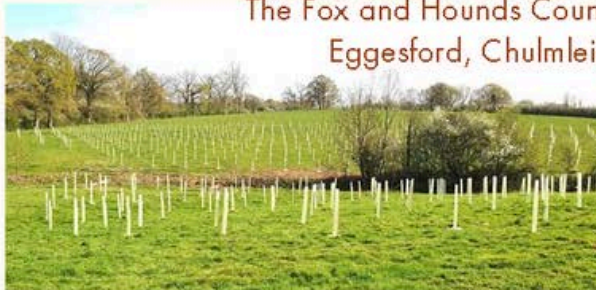
