During the assembly and PSHE lessons, the children learnt about some of the real pioneers in changing history and laws to make everyone feel safe and valued. They learnt about 5 important artists who have used art and their influences to challenge homophobia and discrimination across the world. As usual, the children were keen to learn more about what they can do to make the world a better place to live and to call out the injustices in the world. Additionally, the children also learned about the 9 protected characteristics we have in the UK and why we must follow them as part of our British values and beliefs. Cubs and Tigers

We have had lots of fun in Nursery! Our topic this term is growing and so we have been creating a giant beanstalk and getting messy in our trays planting and scooping.

We've also started growing lots of cress to eat next week. It's been interesting for the children to learn all about planting and growing.



Reception

We enjoyed some yummy pancakes on Tuesday, followed by some pancake races outside.

The sun has started to make an appearance, so we have loved exploring our outdoor area for signs of Spring. The children noticed the daffodils and used pastels to make some beautiful observational drawings.

We have almost learnt all our green sounds and the children have enjoyed applying these sounds to spell words in their sentence dictation activities.

In maths the children have been exploring the numbers 9 and 10.

The children have been using dominoes, Numicon and 10 frames to represent and explore the composition of each number.



Hedgehogs

It has been a lovely first week back with the children. They have settled straight back in and have been working super hard.

In Phonics, we have been continuing to work through the alternative ways to make different sounds. This week, we have been looking at different ways to make 'yoo' and the long 'oo' sound.

We have now learnt all of the Year 1 Common exception words, so we will continue to speed up our recognition of these, as well as practising the spellings.

In maths, we have now moved on to place value within 50. We have been looking at how many 'ones' make up a number, and how many 'tens' this is. We have also been practising to count up to 50, recognising the patterns.

In English, the children have written their own story sentences about Max and the Wild Things. The children have really enjoyed the planning process, and have used their plans to help them write each day. They have also been great at spotting the suffixes 'er', 'ing' and 'est'. We have now moved on to thinking about how to write A Guide to the Wild Things.

In Topic, we have moved on to 'Houses and Homes'. The children looked at the different types of houses, such as terraced, semi-detached, flats etc. They then drew their own home and discussed what type of house they lived in.

In PE, we have moved on to cricket. The children were practising their bowling techniques by using an overarm throw and keeping their arm straight. We have also practised striking the ball with the bat too.

In music, we have used the glockenspiels to learn a simple rhythm to our new song. They have used the notes C, D and F.

We have also enjoyed a fun and action-packed World Book Day this week!

Dragonflies

It has been another busy and exciting few weeks in Year 2!

In maths, we have continued our learning all about money. The children have been working hard to make different amounts in a variety of ways, using coins to show their understanding. We are really impressed with how they are beginning to recognise coins and calculate totals.

In English, we have been thoroughly enjoying our work based on *The Bog Baby* by Jeanne Willis. The children were very intrigued to discover a small habitat that appeared in our classroom, containing clues linked to the story! This sparked lots of excitement, discussion and wonderful ideas for writing. We have also been focusing carefully on letter formation and handwriting, and we are seeing great improvements across the class. Well done, Year 2!

In history, we are continuing our learning about medieval life. The children have been exploring the features of castles and learning about the different jobs people had in medieval times. They have enjoyed imagining what life might have been like during this fascinating period.

Year 2 are very happy to be outdoors again for PE. We have started practising our cricket skills and are working on our throwing, catching and batting. Let's hope Spring is truly here to stay so we can enjoy more of our lessons outside!

In RE, the children impressed us in their final lesson on Islam by showing how much they have learned during this unit. We have now begun a new topic exploring why Easter matters to Christians and how it may be celebrated. We are looking forward to developing our understanding over the coming weeks.

Barn Owls

Barn Owls have started their new topic of an introduction to Europe focusing on France.

We are just finishing off our topic of length and perimeter in maths and are just about to start our new unit on fractions.

Everyone has made a fantastic effort at learning their times tables and we now have 3 green heatmaps which is fantastic in Year 3! Keep trying!

In french we are starting to learn about families and in English we are getting ready to write an amazing information sheet about foxes.

Please ask your child about the new words that they have learnt, some are amazing!

In science we have been looking at animals, including humans and have been looking at the different kinds of food that make up a healthy diet.

Thank you, as always, for your amazing support at home.

Bumblebees

Bumblebees have been busy in maths learning about fractions and have practiced fractions on the ANTON app.

In English we have been working hard on getting our handwriting neater. We have enjoyed our new topic of learning about Italy and volcanoes. This week we learnt about what happened to Pompeii in 79AD and how it was rediscovered years later by accident.

In science we have started learning about states of matter.

We are still enjoying gymnastics in PE and are working well together in small groups to come up with routines.



Squirrels

Squirrels have been working extremely hard to fit in all our learning before the residential next week.

We have begun a new unit in English where we have started to read the book *The Promise* in order to write a piece of work based on it. The children have learnt about modal verbs and adverbs of possibility which they will use in their final piece.

In maths, we are on our second fractions unit and the children are beginning to show that they are much more confident in using fractions.

We have really enjoyed performing *We Will Rock You*. The children have begun to read a very simple melody and to learn about musical notation for beats.

Next, we will look at making our music and using musical notation to write down what we have done.

The children are amazing at swimming and have all made a lot of improvement.

We have enjoyed sharing our recommendations of what to read on World Book Day.

The children have continued to learn about puberty in PSHE and we are now reviewing the questions that they wrote and asked.

As ever, we have been very busy! Hope you have a fantastic weekend.



Otters

Year 6 have settled back into the new half term brilliantly as usual.

The Leavers Hoodies arrived and filled the room with such excitement. They are allowed to wear them **every Friday** as part of their PE kit.

They are continuing their learning on their topic of Frozen Kingdoms and have been finding out about Ernest Shackleton voyages and adventures.

They have begun a new topic in science on light and are looking forward to using lots of resources from the College including light ray boxes and prisms.



About: Angenor de Oliveira, known as Cartola (Portuguese for top hat), (October 11, 1908 – November 30, 1980) was a Brazilian singer, composer and poet considered to be a major figure in the development of samba. Cartola composed, alone or with partners, more than 500 songs. It was not until he was rediscovered at the age of 66 that his music was recorded and he finally became recognised in his home nation and internationally for the music he had been playing most of his life.
