



Dear Parents and Carers

We cannot believe how quickly the spring term is racing by already! All classes are continuing to relish their new learning units. Highlights from across the school in the last two weeks include: the school council getting a visit from Ian Roome MP (thanks to Ms Keen for organising), Year 5 making and eating apple crumble in their forest school sessions, Year 1 excelling at creating their Valentine's art creations, Year 4 exploring different pitches in science and Year 2 investigating the strength of their wind catchers as part of their geography learning.



This week, to mark 'Safer Internet Day', we discussed different Artificial Intelligence (AI) scenarios using resources from the UK Safer Internet Centre whose mission it is to "Make the internet a better place for children and young people." They are a partnership between Childnet International, Internet Watch Foundation and South West Grid for Learning.

The children had to explain whether they thought each AI scenario was a good idea or not and the reasons why. Additionally, we also discussed the impact that being online can have on our mental health and wellbeing as part of Children's Mental Health Week. All staff commented on how sensible, mature, and knowledgeable the children were on keeping themselves safe online during their PSHE lessons. Below are some of the scenarios discussed.

An AI chatbot doesn't have emotions

TRUE

Some chatbots may seem like they have emotions, but they have just been programmed this way. They cannot think or feel for themselves so they can't understand or care about other people's feelings like a person can.

Talking to a chatbot is like talking to a friend

FALSE

Talking to an AI chatbot can be fun and entertaining. It might make jokes with you or express interest in your hobbies or life. However, an AI chatbot is not a person and has only been programmed to seem friendly because it provides a better experience for the user. Talking to a friend is different because you are building a relationship with another person and you both care for each other.

An AI chatbot can understand my problems

FALSE

AI chatbots have access to huge amounts of information on many different topics, which can make it seem like they are an expert or know everything. When you ask a chatbot for advice, it may seem like it is helpful, however it does not understand your problems like a person can and may even give false information. A person like a trusted adult or doctor uses their knowledge on a topic and their understanding of you and your feelings to help you with specific problems.

AI chatbots always give safe advice

FALSE

When you speak to an AI chatbot, they can often find helpful information to share with you. However not all advice given by chatbots is safe and reliable, especially if you are in a difficult or dangerous situation. When you are upset, worried or confused about something, it can be harder to think clearly. Talking to a person means you can understand those emotions and start to feel better. They can also help you consider different options for what to do next, check in with you later or help you get more support you may need.

This is such an important event to promote the love of reading as books as part of the National Year of Reading from the National Literacy Trust.

Depressingly, last year, the National Literacy Trust's annual reading survey found that the percentage of children and young people who said they enjoyed reading was its lowest in 20 years. Just 1 in 3 (32.7%) children and young people aged 8 to 18 said that they enjoyed reading in their free time in 2025. This marks a 36% decrease in reading enjoyment levels since the National Literacy Trust started asking about this in 2005. Worryingly, the drop in reading enjoyment over the last year has been especially steep among primary-aged children and boys, particularly boys aged 11 to 16.

We are hoping that we are helping to buck this trend by promoting the love of reading throughout the school year by organising Bookery author visits, book fayres, Appledore reading festival visits and the numerous visits to the local library.

As you know, Chulmleigh Primary and the Academy Trust has an unwavering commitment to improve attendance and punctuality at school as we know what a difference it makes to every child's attainment and progress. As a reminder, the Education Act (1996) states that parents have a legal responsibility in ensuring that their child/ren attends school.

Section 7 of The Education Act (1996) states that:

The parent of every child of compulsory school age shall cause him to receive efficient full-time education suitable –

- (a) to his age, ability and aptitude, and
- (b) to any special educational needs, he may have, either by regular attendance at school or otherwise.

This means that the parent of a child registered at a school has a legal duty to ensure the child's regular attendance. Failure to fulfil this duty is an offence under **Section 444 of The Education Act (1996)** and could result in a penalty notice or prosecution.

Following the implementation of **The Anti-Social Behaviour Act (2003)**, it is possible that certain cases of unauthorised absence can be dealt with by way of a penalty notice.

Penalty notices offer a means for swift intervention which the County Council will use to combat truancy problems before they become entrenched. The local authority Code of Conduct provides that the power to use penalty notices is applied consistently and fairly and that suitable administrative arrangements are in place.

A parent of a child of compulsory school age, whose attendance has been unsatisfactory, may be required to pay a penalty notice, currently £80.00 if paid within 21 days or £160.00 if paid within 28 days.

If a parents fail to pay a fixed penalty notice, the case reverts back to a **Section 444 (1) of The Education Act (1996)** offence and parents/carers will face prosecution in the Magistrates Court.

We know that children will become ill and this means they need to be kept off of school. NHS Devon have produced a useful APP which gives you advice on how to treat common childhood conditions. This can be found at: [HANDi Paediatric app: advice for common childhood conditions - One Devon](#)

Headlice

We are currently noticing a high number of children in school with head lice. Anyone can get head lice, mainly through direct head-to-head contact but also from sharing hats, brushes and other personal items.

Headlice are a problem in many communities and do not reflect poor hygiene.

Please do your part to prevent the spread of this communicable condition by checking your child(ren) daily for the next few weeks, and on a regular basis thereafter and treating as necessary. Lice infestation is much easier to treat if caught early.

Cubs and Tigers

We braved the weather and went outside to make food for the birds! We used lard, bird seed and pine cones to make feeders full of food. It was wet and lots of fun!

We've also been busy creating lovely pictures in write dance, cooking delicious biscuits, singing and playing instruments and engaging in lots of maths games. It's been a fantastic term so far!



Reception

We wanted to spread some love around the school this week. The Lions made some heart shaped shortbread biscuits. They delivered these to the adults in the school to make them smile! They also enjoyed eating a biscuit of their own!

We continued our community tour of Chulmleigh by visiting the Chulmleigh Fire Station. We had such an AMAZING time exploring the fire engine, trying on the equipment and learning about the different ways the fire service helps us. Lots of the children now want to be firefighters!

We also learnt how to keep safe when using computers and tablets. The children learnt about Smartie the Penguin who made great choices when using his computer.



Hedgehogs

I can't believe we are at the end of another half-term already!

Our phonics lessons have consisted of learning the alternative ways to make the 'j' sound, and we have also looked at the other ways we can make 'l'. The children have been carefully sounding out words and applying their new knowledge when writing words we have discussed in Phonics lessons.

We have been really enjoying our new book, 'Where the wild things are'. The children have written predictions about the book before we read it. We have explored the new vocabulary in the book, like 'gnashed', 'tamed', 'mischief' and used these words within our sentence writing. The children have also been working hard on adding suffixes to words, such as 'er', 'est', 'ing', 'ed'. We have started the planning process to help us write our own story sentences about Max and the wild things! We will be carrying on after half-term.

In maths, we have been adding by counting on. We have been using our number bonds knowledge to 10 to help us spot patterns with number bonds to 20. We have been using lots of manipulatives to help us, especially the numicon. We have used this to help us show doubles too. We have now moved on to subtraction using our number bonds knowledge. We are using number lines to help us remember to go backwards.

In science, we made predictions whether certain objects will float or sink. We then did the experiment and put each one into water. We loved seeing which objects were submerged!

We have also completed the second layer of our paper mache Valentine's bowls which will be going home this week. The children have also designed and made a Valentines day card.

I hope you all have a lovely half-term break and as always, thank you for your continued support!

Dragonflies

In Year 2 maths, we have started a new topic all about money. The children will be learning to recognise and use different coins and notes, and to understand their value. You can support your child at home by encouraging them to handle real coins, talk about prices when shopping, or practice giving change in everyday situations.

After half term, we are looking forward to beginning some fantastic new topics.

In history, we will be learning about castles and medieval life, exploring what life was like in the past and why castles were built. We will compare medieval life to present day, learn about motte and bailey castles and look at the range of roles people had within a castle.

In science, we will start our topic on plants. Children will learn about what plants need to grow, how they stay healthy, and the different parts of flowering plants.

Two of our upcoming trips will help aid the learning in both history and science as we look forward to our trips to **Tiverton castle** and **Rosemoor gardens**.

We hope you have a restful and enjoyable half term.

Barn Owls

Barn Owls have been finishing off our topic on Romans this week. We have been looking at Roman Villas and the Latin names for the rooms in them. We have also been designing mosaic patterns for the floors!

In science, we have been testing the strength of magnets and looking at the points of a compass to give directions.

We have been finishing our English unit based on The Iron Man. I have been so proud of the efforts that Barn Owls have put into their writing, what an improvement! Everyone is trying really hard to improve their handwriting, their vocabulary and their sentence structure, well done Barn Owls!

In maths we are learning about length and perimeter and using rulers to measure cm, mm and m.

Thank you to all of you for supporting your child with their TTRS this week, the heatmaps are improving daily.

Bumblebees

Bumblebees have had lots of fun in maths learning about equivalent lengths.

We went out onto the playground to measure the length of it in metres. We measured 34m and 67cm. This helped us to understand that 1km is a long way because it is 1000m!

In English, we have been practising fronted adverbials and expanded noun phrases in our writing.

We enjoyed learning about Safer Internet Day, we joined a live lesson about staying safe online and being careful of AI. We have also been learning about Children's Mental Health Week and how a sense of belonging is good for our mental health, we attended a live lesson with the School of Kindness.

Year 5 continue to have an extremely busy term.

In maths, we have started to learn short division and are practising this. This is the last part of our multiplication and division unit which we will finish soon.

We have been learning about biomes in geography and are writing about them in our English lessons. We have been thinking about how to use different types of clauses to add information to our writing.

In science, we have finished learning about Earth and Space by learning all about the moon and Earth.

The children have continued to enjoy Forest School. They had a bumper cooking sessions last week which they really enjoyed and have enjoyed their final session this week.

We are halfway through swimming and the improvement especially in the least confident swimmers has been remarkable. The children have been a real credit to the school with this, well done to them!

They have also learnt lots about puberty and how their bodies change. They have shown a lot of maturity with this. Hope you have a fantastic half term and look forward to seeing you when we come back.

Year 6 have been as amazing as they always are and have worked incredibly hard in all subjects. They have adapted to the separate maths and English groups, transitioning between each lesson well and have been showing both Mrs Healey and I what amazing progress they are making.


