Year 5 have been loving their Forest school Fridays and Bikeability sessions last week, with Year 1 also writing some fantastic questions and sentences based on their penguin text.

During our recent OPAL assembly, the children suggested some great ideas. They have asked for more scooters, balance bikes, outdoor toys and games to play with. To help celebrate World Religion Day, we discussed why cultural diversity and respect are vital attributes for everyone to practise in life. The children were confident at recalling key facts from their Religious Education (RE) lessons about the 6 main religions in the world and were surprised to hear that there are actually over 4,000 recognised religions across the world. The children were eager to learn what the main similarities were amongst the main religions and knew that celebrating the different religions helps us to practise diversity and respect in a meaningful way.

As part of World Religion Day, we were very lucky to have Jeanine and Jeremy come into visit every Key Stage 2 class this week and share their Buddhism beliefs and way of life with all the children. The workshops were interactive, fun and very informative. Jeanine and Jeremy were very impressed with the children's behaviour as well as their mature, thought provoking and reflective questions. They travelled all the way from Ivybridge and said that the long journey was worth it to see how enthralled and inquisitive all the classes were!



As part of our school improvement in trying to close the language gap in Early Years, staff are regularly attending Inclusion drop in sessions. The purpose of a drop-in is for staff within school to discuss a concern regarding an individual child, group of children or theme across the school. During the drop-in, the team may ask about a child's background, the current situation, educational needs and previous involvement. The team may recommend strategies, approaches or resources to support further or may signpost to other services for further advice. After the drop-in, additional support may be offered to schools, where required, from the Education, Quality and Inclusion Team. As part of these sessions, staff can only discuss your child by name if you give permission for this to happen. A reminder of our 3 school improvement priorities are below:

Chulmleigh Primary School's Improvement Priorities 2025-2026

- Student Outcomes - To improve attainment and progress in writing attainment in all year groups so the gap between reading and writing continues to narrow.
- Culture – to ensure that learning environments are consistent across the school so they are motivational and ambitious for all. (AET guidance, working walls, language, tidiness)
- Accessible to all – closing the language gap in EYFS. Developing our 2-year-old provision. (Includes consistency of IEPs across the school.)

As you know, Chulmleigh Primary and the Academy Trust has an unwavering commitment to improve attendance and punctuality at school as we know what a difference it makes to every child's attainment and progress. I meet fortnightly with Devon's Attendance Improvement Officer (AIO) who questions each child's attendance percentage across the school and investigates any patterns or trends they can see emerging. A couple of pieces of advice to help improve punctuality and attendance at school from the AIO are:

Know exactly when you need to be at your destination and subtract ten or fifteen minutes to establish your arrival time. This will give you time to go to the bathroom or chat with friends. What time are you expected to be seated in your classroom. If class begins at 8:50, you should arrive at the school by 8:45 and be in your seat at 8:50.

Get enough sleep. If you have trouble getting out of bed in the morning, then make a considerable effort to get to bed earlier. Sufficient sleep is essential for maximum brain function anyway, so you really do not want to ignore this aspect of your scholastic habits.

Last year, the government published advice for schools which we need to adhere to. This includes making parents aware of the link between good attendance and good attainment in school.

Headlice

Cubs and Tigers

We have been busy in our preschool room focusing on writing our initial sound in our name and getting our letter formation right, the children have blown us away with how clever they are.

We have changed our construction area and enjoyed making roads for our cars as well as towers and bridges.

In the toddler room we have focused on our 'Ice' theme and the children have used their gross motor skills to paint an ice palace, we have also made melted snowmen biscuits.



Reception

We had a great time at Exmoor Zoo last week. The children were AMAZING at the zoo. They listened to the adults, walked sensibly around the zoo and asked some great questions. We couldn't have wished for a better class! Despite a bit of rain, the animals were eager to meet the children. We even had a few glimpses of the Exmoor Beast! I am sure you are already aware of the owl who did a very big poo during our zoo keeper talk!

In maths we have learnt how to double a number and how to combine two groups to find the total.

The children have also been writing sentences using their sound knowledge to spell words. We have focused on being able to read back a sentence to an adult, pointing to each word as they say it.



Hedgehogs

It has been another busy couple of weeks in Year 1!

In Phonics, we have been learning the different ways to make the 's' sound and have now moved onto different ways of making an 'oa' sound. The children have been working so hard on their handwriting, making sure their letters are formed correctly and the tall letters stand tall, and the descenders go beneath the line.

In English, we have finished looking at the book 'Could a penguin ride a bike?'. The children have been writing silly questions to match the pictures, and have also been writing answers to their questions. The next book we will be looking at is 'Where the wild things are' by Maurice Sendak.

In maths, we have been carrying on with place value to 20. We have been thinking closely about the number line to 20 and the composition of these numbers. The children have also been thinking about the word 'estimating' and how we can work out where a number goes on a number line when we only have a start and end number. They were amazing at this!

In science, we have started our 'Materials' topic. We have been talking about different materials and whether they are natural or man-made. We then described the properties of these materials. We have also been learning about how every object is made from a material, so we have been investigating to see if we can work out what different objects are made from.

In geography, we have been learning about maps and symbols as part of our 'Bright lights, Big City' topic. We looked at a map of the Chulmleigh area and then guessed what we thought some of the common symbols on a map were. The children then had a go at drawing some of these, and then created their own map and included some of the symbols they had learnt.

In RE, we have been continuing to learn about how Jews live. We have been looking at the Torah and the story of David and Goliath.

In PSHE, we are looking at friendship and how we can be a good friend, as well as thinking of ways to solve disagreements.

The children have also been playing the glockenspiels in time with a song we are learning in music. They are learning to play the notes 'C' and 'D' whilst trying to keep in time with the music. It sounds lovely when they are all playing together!

Dragonflies

In maths, we have started our topic linked to Shape. The children have been developing their understanding of 2D and 3D shapes. They are learning to recognise, name and describe different shapes, as well as explore their properties. We are also focusing on symmetry and have been identifying lines of symmetry. The children have enjoyed using mirrors and a range of shapes to explore vertical and horizontal lines of symmetry. Children can continue this learning at home by going on a shape hunt. You are welcome to send in photos from the shape hunt, which we would love to share and talk about in class.

In English, the children have been working hard finishing off their independent stories and improving their sentence writing by taking part in a daily dictation activity. This regular practice is helping them to improve their spelling, punctuation, handwriting and sentence structure, and we are very pleased with the progress they are making.

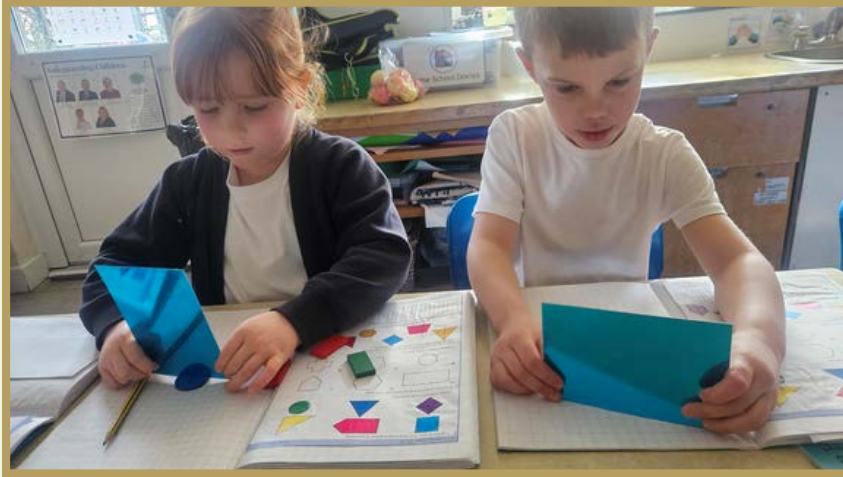

Everyone also designed an oil lamp, had a go at writing Latin, made a mosaic and dressed up in Roman clothes. We also had a tour of the museum and saw the Seaton hoard of Roman coins which was also fascinating.

We are very grateful to the volunteer helpers that came with us to make this trip able to happen, thank you!

We have started a new writing topic based on The Iron Man and Barn Owls have started to really improve their writing and use new vocabulary and incorporate the grammar that they are learning into their writing.

In science we have had great fun finding things that are magnetic and not magnetic.

Thank you, as always, for your support with asking your child to complete Spelling Frame and TTRockstars, this really helps to train their brains!

Bumblebees enjoyed a fantastic visit to RHS Rosemoor last week.

We looked at lots of different sculptures around the garden and then made our own sculptures out of clay and natural materials that we found around the garden.

We have also been busy learning to multiply a three-digit number by a one-digit number in maths.

In English we finished writing our myths and have just begun our new book.

Today we have enjoyed a workshop on Buddhism, where we learnt that everything changes and that is ok.

In science we continue our learning about sound and are enjoying lots of different experiments.

We have started a new unit all about Our Planet linked to the Netflix series with David Attenborough which has an accompanying book.

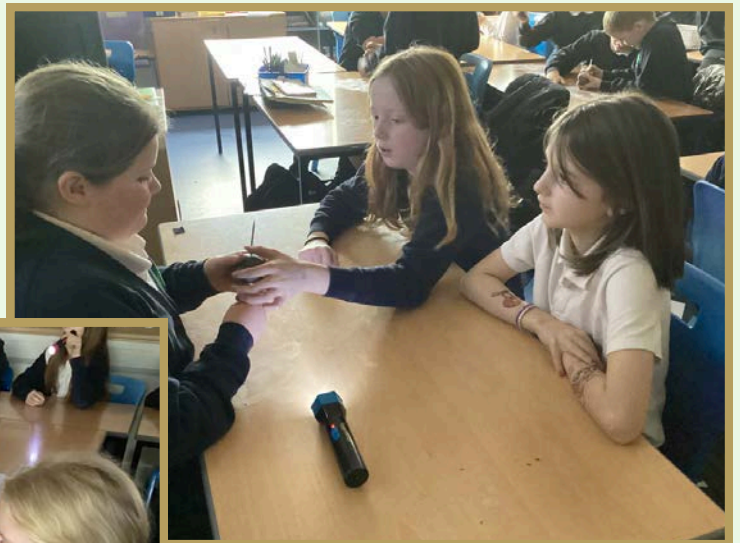
We have carried on learning how to multiply two two-digit numbers using formal methods.

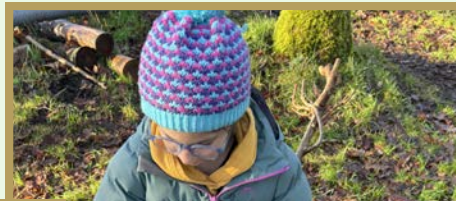
