Dear Parents and Carers

I can't believe we are already at the end of term. The past four weeks have flown by. It really is true what they say- 'time flies when you're having fun!'

Thank you to everyone for your support with the car park. It feels a lot safer in the mornings with the gate closed and cars not driving in after 8.30am.



After Easter, I would like to make a couple of changes. The first one is to move assemblies (including the Friday Lovely Learners') to the afternoons. The reasons are as follows: Having assemblies in the morning eats into our maths and English lessons, and as I'm sure you all appreciate, maths and English are the key subjects at primary school. Secondly, it is apparent that some parents have to dash off early from the Lovely Learners' assembly on Friday mornings. By moving Lovely Learners to the afternoon, it is hoped that parents will be able to stay for the whole assembly and can then take their children home at the end. Celebrating the children's achievements is also a lovely way to end the week. Therefore, after the Easter holidays, our Lovely Learners assembly will start at **2.45pm** and will finish at **3.15pm**.

The other change is that after Easter, children are no longer to come to school dressed in their PE kits. As is the case in all the other primary schools in the trust, children should bring their PE kits to school in a PE bag, which will stay in school, and they will get changed just before their PE lesson each week. Chulmleigh Primary School has a lovely smart uniform, but when half the school are in PE kits most days, it detracts from our uniform. It also means that if PE kits are left in school, teachers can have 'ad hoc' PE lessons when the weather permits!

Some highlights of the past two weeks are the multi-skills festival held at St Thomas of Canterbury school, Lapford. Our Nursery, Reception and Year 1 children all had a great time and represented CPS brilliantly. Thanks to Miss Johnson for taking the netball team to a competition at Park School in Barnstaple. The team won 3 of their matches and were a credit to CPS. A special mention must also go to Cohen in Year 5 and Isabella in Year 3. Both came first in a gymnastics competition which had entrants from across the whole of Devon. This is a fantastic achievement and everyone is so proud of them.

In other news, the staff and I are in the process of finalising our new behaviour management system. This will be shared with you after Easter.

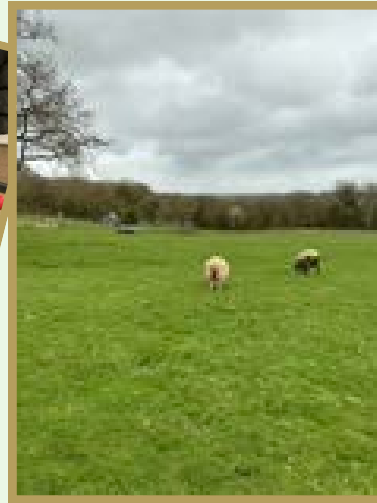

We've had a lovely time in Nursery visiting the school farm where we saw the sheep and chickens and making Easter biscuits and Easter crafts!

We would like to wish everyone a happy Easter and we look forward to seeing all our lovely Nursery children in the Summer term!



## Lions

The Lions enjoyed a lovely morning of sport at St Thomas of Canterbury last Tuesday. They were a real credit to the school, demonstrating amazing teamwork, respect and most importantly being kind to others. The children were treated to a carousel of different sporting activities. They were in mixed teams across the academy, so they were able to make some new friends.

This week we made our own Easter garden, exploring the Easter story together and finding objects in the classroom to add to our garden (donkey, eggs, lambs, cross and stones for a tomb). The children also enjoyed making their own easter egg tissue paper collages.

We visited Harriet's Flower Shop yesterday. The children learnt about the different flowers at the shop and asked lots of questions! A big thank you to Harriet for this lovely learning experience.



## Hedgehogs

I can't quite believe that we are at the end of another term already!

In English this week, we have started our new book which is called 'There's a tiger in the garden'. The children were animal explorers to find out which mystery animal was in the book. We have learnt some new vocabulary, for example magnificent, peered and towering which all appear in our new story. The children have then written sentences that have included some of these new and interesting words that they have learnt! They are using capital letters and end punctuation with much more accuracy now which is amazing!

In maths, we have spent our last 2 weeks learning about measuring. We have learnt how to use a ruler properly. We have also explored capacity and volume, learning the difference between them both. We have used the scales to work out how many multilink cubes were needed to balance the scales with different objects on the other side.

The children have continued to be fantastic in their Phonics lessons! We had lots of visitors in to watch us this week, and they all commented on how amazing they were. They were polite, respectful and ready to learn.

We have come to the end of our history topic, which was 'Homes and houses'. Our next topic will have a geography focus and will be about 'My school and local area'. We are also at the end of our 'Materials' topic in science, but we are really looking forward to our 'Plants' topic next. We will also enjoy a trip to the Honey farm in the next half-term (more information to follow after Easter).

The children have been learning about fruits and vegetables in DT and designed their smoothie bottle. As a class, we have decided to make strawberry, banana and apple smoothies. We will do this on the 1st week back after Easter. We will then move back onto Art where our focus will be on drawing.

The children have been doing another sewing project with Miss Charlotte, creating a beautiful Easter Bunny or Easter Egg. We have also made some small cards to go alongside this, using a pointillism technique. The children have recapped the story of Easter and why people celebrate this. The children enjoyed an Easter-egg on the last day, followed by a surprise visit from a real-life Easter Bunny!

As always, thank you for your continued support- it has been another lovely term with the children.

## Dragonflies

We have had another busy and exciting few weeks in class, and we would like to share some of the learning that has been taking place.

In maths, the children have been focusing on multiplication. They have been learning and confidently using new mathematical vocabulary, as well as developing their problem-solving skills through a range of engaging activities.

In English, we have started exploring a new book called Grandad's Camper. The children have enjoyed making predictions about the story using a variety of picture clues, and it has sparked some thoughtful discussions and imaginative ideas.

In history, the class has been learning more fascinating facts about castles. They have been particularly interested in Tiverton Castle and have been writing their own interesting facts in preparation for our upcoming trip in a few weeks.

We were also very proud of the children during their recent trip to take part in the multi-skills festival. They showed great enthusiasm and teamwork, and it was lovely to see them enjoying activities alongside children from our two other Trust primary schools. Teamwork has also been a big strength of their PE unit in cricket skills, and they have made great progress in catching, batting and learning to bowl in the past few weeks.

The children are ready to make their healthy food wraps (in DT) when we return after Easter. Rachel sent out a message about this earlier this week in case anyone has any questions about the healthy foods we are using.

Finally, thank you for your continued support with your children's reading, spellings, and homework. It makes a real difference to their progress and confidence.

## Barn Owls

Barn Owls have been working incredibly hard over the past few weeks and have approached their Spring assessments with a wonderfully mature attitude.

In English, we are now publishing our informative leaflets about foxes, which we are excited to share with King Charles, Prince William and Greg James!

The children have made fantastic progress in improving their handwriting, using technical vocabulary and carefully checking their spelling.

In maths, we have been exploring mass and capacity, and have been amazed by just how heavy different weights can be.

In science, we have been learning about different types of skeletons, while in geography we have been locating countries in Europe and discovering interesting facts about France.



With Easter fast approaching, you will find below some tips to help you support the whole family with brushing at home.

### Tips for toothbrushing at home

**Supervise children** - Children under the age of 7 should be supervised when brushing their teeth, using a pea size amount of fluoride toothpaste and brush for 2 minutes twice a day.

**Frequency of sugar** - It is the frequency of sugar consumption that contributes towards tooth decay. Keep sugary snacks to mealtimes.
