Cubs and Tigers

In Nursery we had a great time learning about bugs and creating lovely paintings of butterflies. We learnt about symmetry and made patterns with different colours.

We also made good use of the lovely weather and took our learning outside.

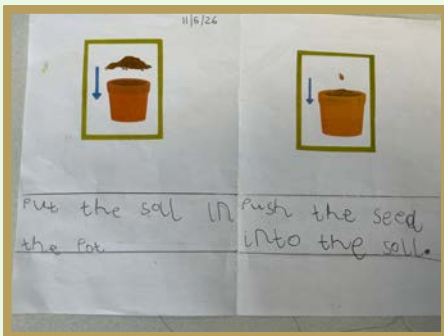
The children have worked hard listening to stories, counting blocks when building towers, learning to create repeating patterns and generally having lots of fun!



Lions

The children have been busy observing our caterpillars. They have now all formed a chrysalis and we are eagerly anticipating the emergence of some beautiful butterflies.

In our writing the children have been using the Ready, Steady, Write resources which are used by the rest of the school. The focus for this half-term has been on writing instructions for planting a seed. We have provided lots of opportunities for the children to rehearse these instructions when planting seeds. We were so proud of the writing produced by the children. Not only did they write clear instructions, but they remembered to use their sounds to spell words.



Hedgehogs

It's been another busy 2 weeks in Year 1!

In English, the children finished off writing their story sentences about 'Nora and the Tiger'. We have now moved on to a new book called 'How to find a yeti', which the children are really enjoying. We are starting to think about writing sentences that you would find in a diary. The children have learnt some new vocabulary and they are trying hard to use these words and phrases in their own writing.

In phonics, we are recapping the sounds that we have already learnt in preparation for the phonics screener after half-term. The children are working hard on spotting the digraphs/trigraphs before sounding out the words. We have continued to use our phonics knowledge to help us spell.

In maths, we are continuing to practise counting in 2's, 5's and 10's every day! We have moved onto our 'fractions' topic, where we have been learning to recognise and find half of a quantity. We will move on to quarters soon.

In science, we have planted our sunflower seeds! Some of them are beginning to germinate, so we are observing them closely. We have also been carefully watching our chick eggs in our incubator! The eggs have been inside for around 3 weeks, and are ready to hatch any day now which is so exciting.

In RE, we are continuing to learn about the Creation Story and why Christians say thank you to God. We have been looking at festivals, such as the harvest, and thinking about why this is celebrated and what it represents.

In PE, we have been practising our athletic events, such as sprints and javelin. The children worked hard to make sure they were standing properly and holding the javelin correctly to get it to go the furthest they could. Some of them really did fly!

We are really looking forward to the cricket festival on Monday, as well as Sports Day on Tuesday. It will be a lovely, fun, action-packed week to end the half-term.

Dragonflies

This half term in maths, we have moved on to learning about fractions. In Year 2, the children will be learning to recognise, find, name and write fractions including $\frac{1}{3}$, $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{2}{4}$ and $\frac{3}{4}$ of a length, shape, set of objects or quantity. They will also learn to write simple fractions, recognise equivalent fractions such as $\frac{2}{4}$ and $\frac{1}{2}$, and solve problems involving fractions in practical contexts.

Alongside our new learning, we will continue to recap previous mathematical concepts to strengthen confidence and fluency. We will also be regularly practising our times tables, particularly the 2, 5 and 10 times tables, to help improve recall speed and support wider mathematical understanding.

We are coming to the end of our English unit based on the book Grandad's Camper. The children have started planning and will then be writing their own memory narratives inspired by the story and the themes explored throughout the unit. Alongside this, we have also been focusing on handwriting and correct letter formation to support presentation and writing fluency.

In reading, lots of children have now started on the Accelerated Reader scheme and have really enjoyed choosing their own books independently. Many children have already completed their first online quiz and have been excited to track their progress.

The children have thoroughly enjoyed painting their plant pots and transferring their seedlings into larger pots. It has been wonderful to see their enthusiasm and care while learning about growing and looking after plants.

We have been enjoying preparing for sports day (next week) in our PE sessions, practising our athletics skills. The children have really enjoyed being able to use the field this term.

In music we have been learning about some of the folk music inspired by the British Isles, learning about typical folk instruments, bands and artists, and singing traditional songs. We have used this inspiration as a starting point for revising watercolour painting skills, observing and creating pictures of seascapes,

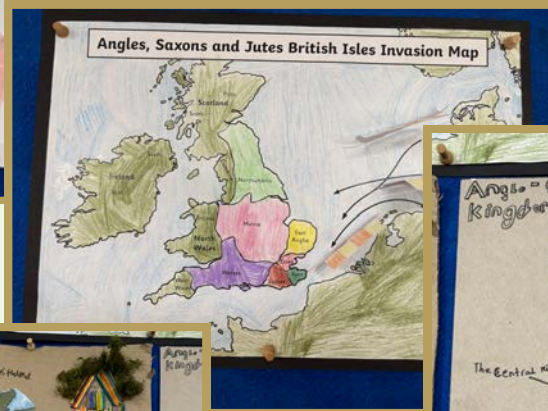
Barn Owls

Barn Owls have been learning all about Anglo-Saxons and they have done some fantastic homework creating a map of the Anglo Saxon kingdoms, some have even made some Anglo-Saxon weapons. Well done Barn Owls!

Everyone has worked really hard at writing a direct narrative and we are almost near completion of our final piece.

In maths, we are working on the topic of money. If you are able, it would be great if everyone could try paying for something with some real money.

In science, our seeds have grown and we are loving finding out about how plants work.



Bumblebees

Bumblebees have been continuing to work hard on their times tables ready for the official check after half term. In other maths, we have been learning about fractions and decimals and have just moved on to money. Having a solid understanding of place value, we have been able to understand decimals really well.

In English we continue to focus on using all the grammatical features we have learnt in Year 4 in our writing and the children are doing this really well; their handwriting is also really neat!

In PE we have been practising our athletic skills ready for sports day next week and have some great javelin throwers amongst us.

In history we are really enjoying learning about Ancient Egypt and have been writing our names in hieroglyphics.

In art we completed our mosaic tiles and they look amazing!

In French this half term we have been learning the names for items of clothing in French and this week have been saying what colour clothing we are wearing! In computing we have been coding using if/else statements and also learning about online safety and online bullying.



Squirrels

We have had a very busy few weeks in Squirrels as usual.

In science, we have continued our learning about forces by exploring upthrust and water resistance by making different shapes out of boats. We have also used a Newton metre to measure the friction of different surfaces to try and work out which surface would be the best for a non-slip floor.

In English, we have written persuasive texts and have now started a new unit looking at the book, "The Lost Book of Adventure".

In our maths learning, we have finished our unit on area and perimeter and are starting to look at statistics. We are also practising some extra arithmetic.

We are busily preparing for Sports Day in PE. We have practised sprinting technique and push through technique.

In PSHE, we have been thinking about emotions and learning more about online safety.

In music, we have started to learn a new tune on the glockenspiels.

About: Babatunde Olatunji was a Nigerian drummer, educator, social activist, and recording artist. Olatunji was born in the village of Ajido, near Badagry, Lagos State, in southwestern Nigeria. Olatunji was known for making impassioned speeches for social justice before performing in front of a live audiences.

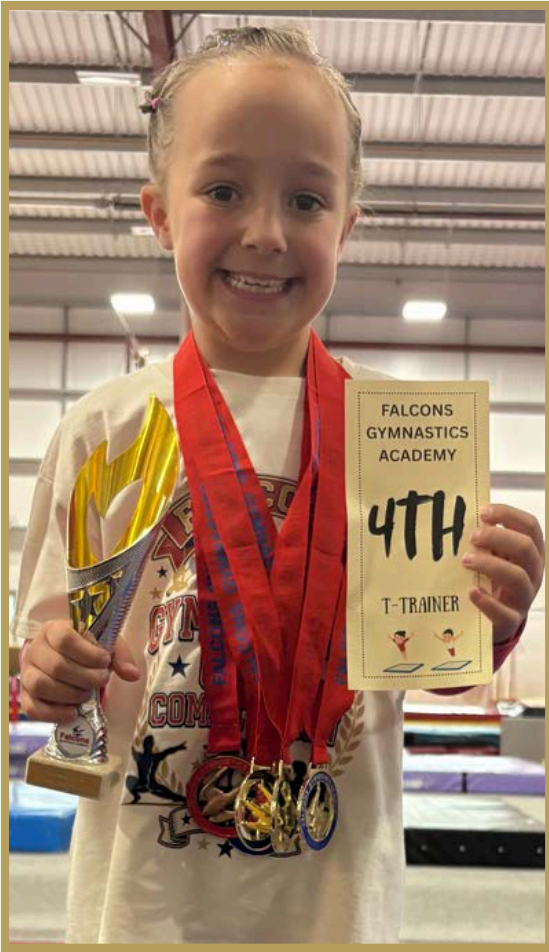
