Dear Parents and Carers

What a great two weeks back we have had. What a wonderful vibrant school Chulmleigh Primary is. The enrichment opportunities on offer are already fantastic and this term, in addition to our current pupil-led clubs (French club and mental health club) some of our Year six children have offered to add further new clubs.

On Mondays we have dance club run by Immy, Scarlett and Lacey. Tuesdays we have coding club which is run by Noah (assisted by Oliver in Year 5). Wednesdays we have craft club run by Daisy, Elowen, Maryna and Isaac and on Fridays we have comic club which is run by Charley, Louis and Finn (reading material, not stand-up!)

Running clubs is a great opportunity for our older children to develop their organisational skills and a way for them to take on responsibility. So far, the attendees have reported that they are really enjoying the new clubs, the staff have been so impressed by how well the pupils have planned and are delivering their sessions.



Sensory room

The room in between my office and our admin office is a really useful space, however, I feel it could be better resourced. We will therefore shortly be trying to raise funds to try and adapt it to better meet the needs of our children. Sensory rooms in primary schools offer a range of benefits for children, particularly those with sensory processing differences or special educational needs. These include: improved emotional regulation, better engagement with learning, support for mental health and wellbeing, fewer behavioural issues and exclusions and a more inclusive culture. The room will also continue to be a space where parents and professionals can meet. The picture below is just an example. I am currently in the process of getting quotes and designs. Watch this space!

Breakfast club/s

I am delighted that we are going to be able to offer Breakfast club from 7.30am each day after half term. I appreciate how difficult it can be for working parents when they have a distance to travel. I am very grateful to our wonderful staff for being willing to adapt working patterns and to come in at this early hour.

At the moment, we are not able to offer the free breakfast and childcare from 8.30am which is on offer in some schools. This is a government initiative and due to the success of the schools which trialed it- including our very own East Worlington and St Thomas of Canterbury schools. It is going to be rolled out nationally to the remaining schools at some stage. We will keep you updated as this progresses.

Cubs and Tigers

It was lovely to see all our Nursery children back after the Easter break.

Our topic this half term is 'Treasures in the garden' so we have been going on a bug hunt watching the bees go into our lovely new bug hotel and making bugs in the playdough!

It's been great to make use of the better weather and get stuck in to lots of outdoor learning like digging in the sand, making number lines on the grass, using clipboards to draw and write and generally having fun in the sun!



Lions

We had some hairy pets arrive on Tuesday! The children were very excited that our caterpillars arrived. We spent time talking about caterpillars and the life cycle which takes place. We will keep you updated as the children are keeping their own diaries of the caterpillars. We have also been searching for minibeasts outside. We were delighted that Ellie's Dad (Matt) made us an amazing bug hotel. It's fantastic and the children are checking it daily to see which bugs have moved in!

Last week we had the pleasure of visiting Chulmleigh hairdressers. We managed to fit all the children in the building and they were great (as always) at asking lots of questions. We have also been busy back in school, making Chulmleigh using large cardboard boxes! The children have used pens and card to make signs for each of the buildings.

We had the most exciting time visiting the Honey Farm this week. The children were a credit to the school. Highlights included dressing up as bees, the bee waggle dance, making candles, tasting honey, planting seeds, playing in the soft play and a surprise tractor ride. In addition, we had singing and games on the bus!

A big thank you to the adults that supported us on the trip, we could not have done it without you.



Hedgehogs

It has been a lovely couple of weeks back after half-term! As always, we have been super busy!

In phonics, we are still learning lots of new, alternative ways to make the sounds that we already know. The children work so hard in phonics, and have been writing lots of longer words that include the new sounds in. We are also continuing to practise spelling the Year 1 'common exception words'.

In English, we are carrying on with 'There's A Tiger In The garden'. The children have been using the new vocabulary that we've learnt to include in their own story sentences. They have been planning with pictures, and using this the next day to help them write. They have included lots of words with suffixes, such as 'ing', 'ed', 'er' and 'est'.

In maths, we have moved on to our multiplication and division topic. We have been doing lots of counting in 2's, 5's and 10's! As well as this, we have been making equal groups, followed by making arrays and repeated addition questions. We have also been learning about rows and columns.

We finished off our DT project in our first week back. The children chopped up bananas and strawberries so we could put them in our smoothies! We have now started to plan our new project which is to make a car/buggy to protect an egg. The children are in teams, and started by coming up with a group name and a logo.

In science, we have started our 'plants' topic. The children have learnt about the different parts of a plant, followed by drawing their own and labelling this.

In RE, we are looking at the 'creation story' and how Christians believe the world was made.

In PE, we have been doing some athletics! The children have practised their sprinting and standing starts ready for Sports Day!

It has been lovely to catch up with you all during parent's evening. Thank you!

Dragonflies

We have had a fantastic few weeks in Year 2 and are delighted to share some of our recent learning with you.

Our trip to Tiverton Castle was a great success. The children thoroughly enjoyed exploring the different areas of the castle and were fascinated by all the interesting facts they learned throughout the day. They represented the school beautifully and showed great curiosity and enthusiasm.

In maths, we are continuing our learning on multiplication and division. The children are becoming more confident and are learning new mathematical vocabulary to help them explain their thinking clearly.

In English, we have been enjoying our work based on the story Grandad's Camper. The children have been writing setting descriptions and are working hard to improve their letter formation and overall presentation.

In science, the children have been busy planting seeds and are learning about plant growth, including the different parts of a plant and what they need to grow.

We are very much looking forward to our upcoming trip to Rosemoor, which will further support this learning.

In history, we have started exploring the local history of Chulmleigh. The children will be finding out more about their local area and how it has changed over time.

Barn Owls have been incredibly busy over the past few weeks, and it's been fantastic to watch their enthusiasm for learning.

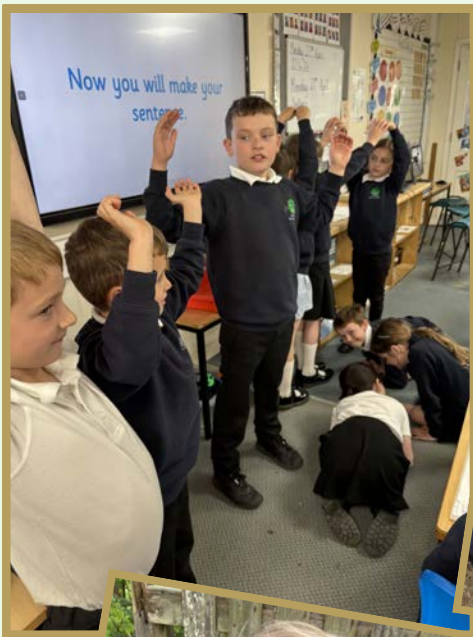
In English, we have begun an exciting new unit based on the beautiful book "Rhythm of the Rain." The children are really enjoying exploring the story while developing their writing skills. We have been focusing on using the possessive apostrophe, understanding when to use "a" or "an," and taking extra care to improve our handwriting. It's been brilliant to see the pride the children are taking in presenting their work neatly.

In maths, we have recently completed our topic on mass and capacity, where the class worked hard to understand and apply their knowledge in practical contexts. We are now moving on to our new topic: fractions.

In science, our focus is on plants. We are learning about how plants grow, exploring the different parts of a plant, and understanding the role each part plays. The children have been asking thoughtful questions.

It has been a busy and productive few weeks, and we are very proud of all the effort the Barn Owls are putting into their learning.

Bumblebees

Bumblebees have started learning about Ancient Egypt this half term and have enjoyed learning about how important the River Nile was for the ancient civilisation.

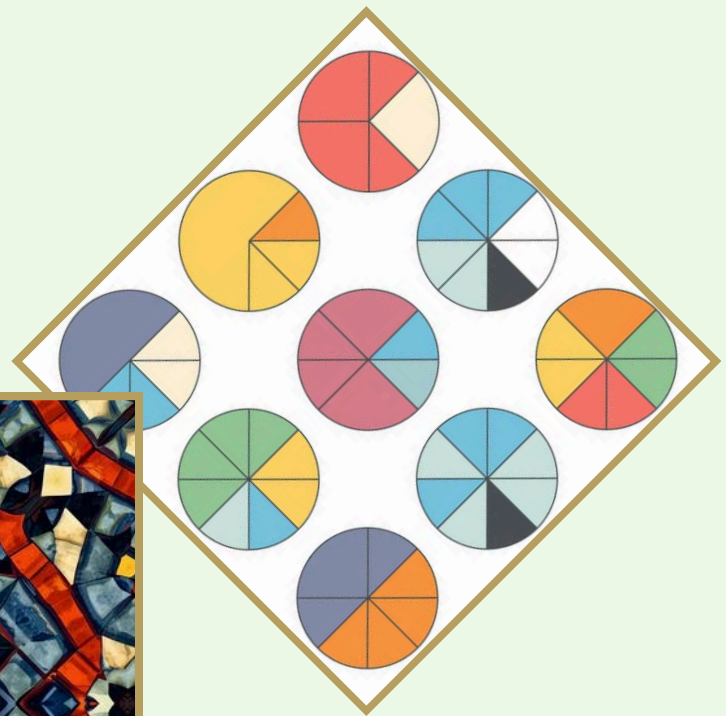
In science we are learning about how animals have adapted to be able to live in different habitats and will be learning about classification keys later in the term.

In maths the children have been working really hard on understanding fraction and decimals, and their thorough understanding of place value has really helped them with this. We are also continuing to practice for the times tables check which is coming up after May half term, so please keep practising everyone, they are already scoring really high on our practice tests.

Our English writing for this unit is focused on diary writing which the children are really enjoying. They have all been working hard on making sure their handwriting is neat and doing a fantastic job!

We are all enjoying athletics for PE, which has consisted of running for the past two weeks, but will move on to other skills for the rest of the half term.

In art we have been designing mosaic tiles and the children are really excited about making them!



Squirrels

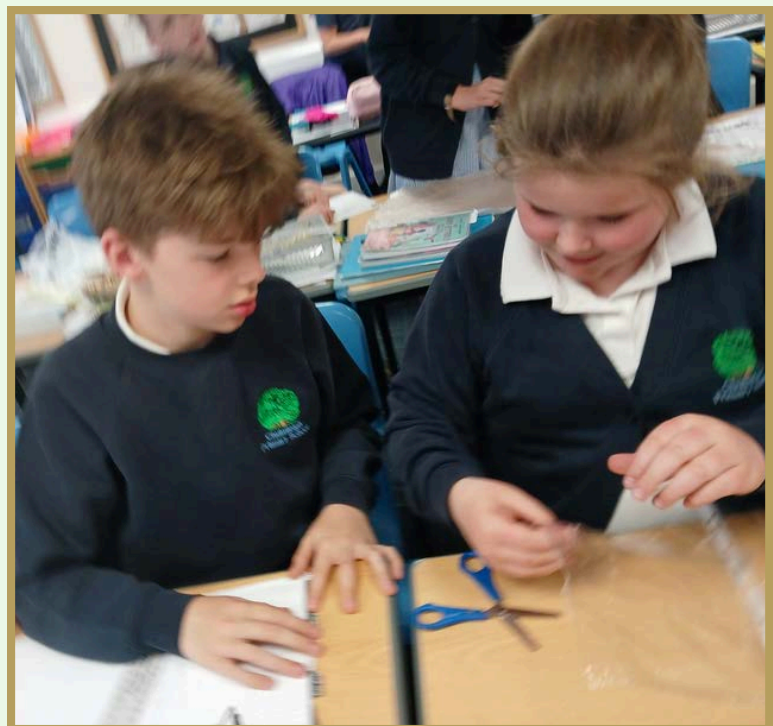

We have been learning about decimals in maths and we have been thinking about thousandths and how to compare decimals. The children have started learning about Africa as a continent and beginning to understand the Transatlantic Slave Trade.

In PE, we have been very busy practising running and thinking about how to improve our running technique. The children created some fantastic bread rolls in DT and made parachutes in science which we tested to learn more about air resistance.

About: Babatunde Olatunji was a Nigerian drummer, educator, social activist, and recording artist. Olatunji was born in the village of Ajido, near Badagry, Lagos State, in southwestern Nigeria. A member of the Ogu people, Olatunji was introduced to traditional African music at an early age. His education took him to America where his percussion skills were lauded. Olatunji was known for making impassioned speeches for social justice before performing in front of a live audiences.
